## Red Wings Disavow From NHL Players Association

**DETROIT (AP)**—The players' protest on the Detroit Red Wings' decision Tuesday publicly disavowed themselves from the National Hockey League Players' Association and its lawsuit in a unanimous action.

John A. Hurt, counsel for the players, and team captain Red Kelly issued a press release simultaneously with the mailing of a letter to the association stating their position.

Hurt said the players' association, formed last spring and headed by Ted Lindsay, long-time Red Wing, and Chicago Black Hawks, showed a "complete lack of good faith."

He said the \$500,000 lawsuit filed by the association last month against NHL club owners and president Clarence Campbell is unauthorized and we can disavow it.
