# Island Golfers Named To Team

**SAINT JOHN, N.B. (CP)** — An 18-foot birdie putt attempt Sunday almost made 14-year-old Carl Shaw of Aroostook Valley Country Club the youngest Junior golf champion in the history of the New Brunswick and Prince Edward Island Golf Association.

Shaw, winner of the midget division, was short on his long putt in an effort to win the title over Jean Boudreau of Edmundston.

Boudreau sank his 3 1/2-foot putt to tie Shaw with 240 in the 54-hole tournament staged at Riverside Country Club, and make a playoff necessary.

The 16-year-old Boudreau, winner of the Junior Division and leader in the 106-hole inter-provincial team matches, canned a 12-foot putt for a par four on the long 410-yard No. 1 hole and won the title. Shaw had an 80 and Boudreau an 81 in the final round.

Twelve of the 100 competitors played an additional 18-holes in the championship division. Boudreau led the general field

with a 36-hole total of 150, while Shaw, Michael Whitty, of Miramichi and Bob Irwin of Charlottetown tied with 160. Whitty and Irwin finished in a tie for runner-up position at 243 for 54 holes.

John Rooke of Moncton captured the juvenile title with 163. Ian Irwin of Algonquin was the juvenile runner-up, four strokes off the pace.

Boudreau led the inter-provincial team play with a six-round total of 479. Ron Garrett of Charlottetown, was the runner-up at 485, while Shaw and Irwin of Charlottetown tied for fourth position with 489. Roger Brown of Riverside was named the alternate team member.

The inter-provincial team matches will be played at Brandon, Man., Aug. 22-23.

Rooke, the juvenile champion Andrus Irwin will be the juvenile, last. Midgets Danek and Stephen Wetmore, who will play with the N.B. P.E.I. inter-provincial team against the Nova Scotia Golf Association team in a challenge match at Charlottetown Aug. 14.

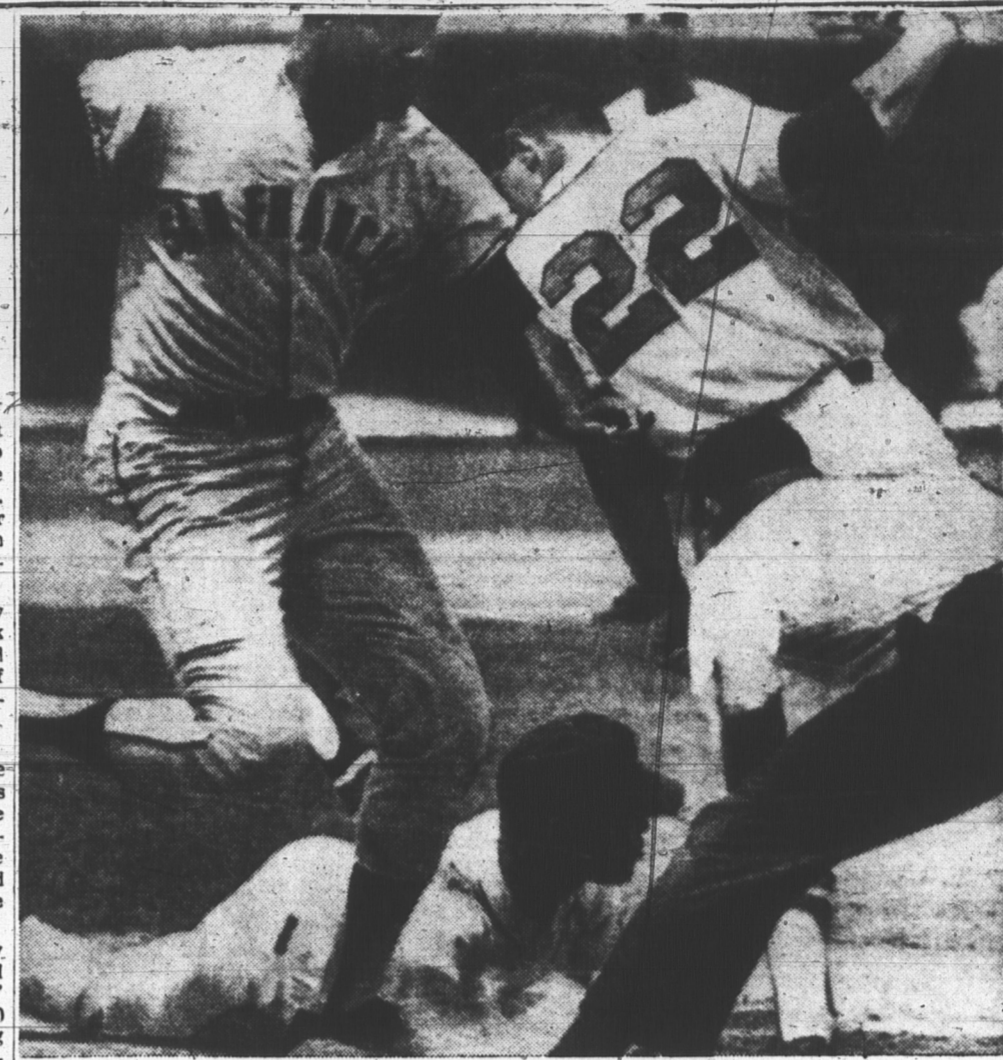
# Casper Captures Crown

**INDIANAPOLIS, Ind. (AP)** — Billy Casper, carrying a sheet of tournament rules in his hip pocket after five players were disqualified for ignoring them, became the first PGA player this year to win four titles when he captured the \$92,000 Speedway Golf Festival Sunday.

Casper, unbothered by any pollen count that could wreck his battle with allergies, fired a 34-36-70 for a 72-hole total of 277, 11 under par, in dismantling the new speedway course. Par is 36-36-72.

Defending champion Bruce Crampton and three others were disqualified early in the meet for not following the continuous putting rule on the greens. Doug Ford, 1960 and 1961 winner, went out the same way Sunday.

"I just can't understand how these fellows can go out and play and not know the rules," Willie Casper, who added \$16,400 to his PGA money leading list that has now reached \$97,915 for the year.

# Giants Snap Loss Streak; 'Birds' Fly To Victory

**ATLANTA (AP)** — Hal Lanier rapped four straight singles, drove in two runs and scored another, leading San Francisco to a 4-3 victory over Atlanta Sunday that snapped the Giants' losing string of four.

Willie McCovey hit a solo home run in the seventh, his 20th, and it proved decisive.

**MINNEAPOLIS (AP)** — Eddie Watt and reliever Eddie Fisher combined for a five-hitter as the Baltimore Orioles blanked Minnesota 4-0 Sunday, thwarting Jim Kaat's bid for his 15th victory.

The American League-leading Orioles bunched seven of their nine hits into two innings for three runs and handed Kaat, the league's top winner, his eighth defeat.

**ST. LOUIS (AP)** — Dick Stuart, who earlier drove in two runs with a single and homer, doubled home the tying run with two out in the ninth and scored on John Roseboro's single.

sparking Los Angeles to a 6-4 victory over St. Louis Sunday.

The triumph, coupled with Philadelphia's double victory over Pittsburgh Pirates, vaulted the Dodgers into first place in the National League, one percentage point ahead of the Pirates and three points ahead of San Francisco Giants.

The loss halted the Cardinals' winning streak at six games and was only their second in the last 14 games.

Orlando Cepeda led St. Louis to a 4-3 lead, rapping three hits, scoring two runs and driving in one.

**PITTSBURGH (AP)** — Doug Clemens' two-out, run-scoring single in the 10th inning Sunday gave Philadelphia Phillies a 6-5 victory over Pittsburgh Pirates that completed a sweep of a doubleheader and topped the Pirates from first place in the National League.

The Phillies' Bill White collected seven hits and drove in five runs in the double victory that dropped the Pirates one percentage point behind Los Angeles Dodgers, who defeated St. Louis Cardinals 6-4.

**NEW YORK (AP)** — Bob Shaw checked Chicago on five hits as New York Mets edged the Cubs 2-1 Sunday.

The Mets, finishing July with an 18-14 record, scored the deciding run in the sixth inning when Chicago center fielder Adolfo Phillips lost Ed Kranepool's fly ball in the sun for a triple and Cleon Jones delivered Kranepool with a single.

Shaw, bringing his season mark to 9-9, blanked the Cubs on three hits until the eighth, when Phillips reached first on Ken Boyer's error and scored while Glenn Beckert was being thrown out at second trying to stretch a single.

The Met right-hander, who struck out five, has won seven games since joining the club in a deal with San Francisco earlier in the year.

**CINCINNATI (AP)** — Leo Cardenas stole home in the fifth inning, capping a four-run rally that sparked Cincinnati Reds to a 10-6 victory over Houston Astros and a split of their doubleheader Sunday.

Dave Giusti pitched a three-hitter as the Astros won the first game 7-0, ending their seven-game losing string and the Reds' five-game winning streak.

**WASHINGTON (AP)** — Tony Conigliaro batted in two runs with a first-inning homer and the lead run with a single in the eighth inning, leading Boston Red Sox to a 2-2 victory over Washington Senators Sunday.

**ANAHEIM (AP)** — Leon Wagner drove in two runs with his 16th homer and a single, leading Cleveland Indians to a 3-2 victory over California Angels Sunday.

Rocky Colavito also homered for Cleveland as the Indians salvaged the final game of a three-game series.

**CHICAGO (AP)** — Right-hander Joel Horlen and southpaw Tommy John hurled Chicago White Sox to a 4-1 and 5-0 doubleheader sweep over New York Yankees Sunday.

Horlen survived a shaky start in the opener when he yielded five singles in the first two innings, before settling down and retiring the last 24 batters in order.

The Yankees wasted singles by Bobby Richardson and Joe

Peppone in the first inning and loaded the bases in the second on singles by Roger Maris, Jake Gibbs and Clete Boyer before Horlen took charge.

**KANSAS CITY (AP)** — The Detroit Tigers, held to one hit by rookie Jim Nash for eight innings, scored three runs in the ninth for a 5-4 victory over Kansas City Athletics, then completed a doubleheader sweep Sunday by whipping the Athletics 7-1 behind Earl Wilson's six-hit pitching.

Nash, a 21-year-old right-hander, limited the Tigers to a two-run homer by Norm Cash in the fourth inning of the opener but was removed after walking leadoff hitter Don Wertz in the ninth.

## Invitational To Ozark Pete In Charlottetown Racing

Ozark Pete, a seven year old black gelding by Eddie Haverdam Melvins, captured both ends of the featured Invitational Pace at the Charlottetown Driving Park Saturday night.

Owner-driver Sid Stead had his fine pacer in top form as he won both dashes easily, winning the fourth in 2:09, fastest time of the night, and the eighth in 2:09-2.

Whirl A Wick owned by Reagh Sudsbury and driven by Don MacNeill won dashes 2 and 7 in the times of 2:13 and 2:13. The nine year old brown mare by Direct Way dam Trusty Chief went to top both times in posting the double wins for veteran driver Don MacNeill who drive the mare expertly. Ripover-owned and driven by Don Gass finished 24, and Timmy H. owned and driven by Elmer Clow was 3-2.

Another double dash winner on the nine-dash card was Irene Mir who won dashes 3 and 7 in the times of 2:13 and 2:13. The five year old brown mare by Mac Primrose was an easy winner each time out for driver Robert Craig.

In dash three Mystery Judy leaving from the five spot went to top, with Irene Mir and Doctor Alex covered up "along the rail". As the field reached for the three-quarter pole Craig moved with Irene Mir and Don MacNeill moved with Doctor Alex and that's how they finished at the wire.
