

**1st Alberton

ALBERTON — The first hymn festival to be held in Alberton was presented in Alberton United Church Friday evening with all church choirs of the town taking part. They were directed by Mrs. Ruth Sommers.

Organists for the evening were Miss Anne Leard, Mrs. E. E. Larier, Mrs. Mary Millican and Mrs. Hubert Campbell. Each choir sang two selections and there were hymns in which the congregation joined. The procession hymn was "All People That On Earth Do Praise!"

The invocation prayer was by Rev. David MacDonald, the Presbyterian Choir sang "The Lord's My Shepherd" and "Spirit of God, Descend Upon My Heart."

The Old Testament lesson was read by Rev. R. Neas, after which the congregational hymn, "Praise To The Lord" was sung.

The sacred heart choir sang "Gloria In Excelsis Deo" and "Lord, Accept That Thank We Offer." The New Testament lesson, read by Rev. Gerald Seels, was followed by the congregational hymn, "Christ Is Made The Sure Foundation." 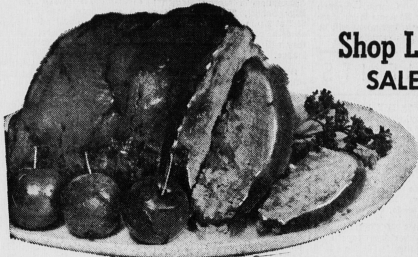

**SECRET SERVICE**  
**Agent Charged**  
**In U.S. Court**

CHICAGO (AP) — A secret service agent was charged here with offering to sell a government investigative report to a defendant in a counterfeiting trial — in what officials called the first such case in the history of the secret service.

U.S. Attorney Edward V. Hanrahan said the arrest of Abraham Bolden, 29, of Chicago late Monday night was to his knowledge the first "trial" against the secret service—the entire secret service.

Officials said Bolden was charged Bolden asked \$50,000 in return for the secret file.

Officials said Bolden was regarded as one of the service's top agents in Chicago.

The government charged Bolden obtained an excerpt from the secret service report which formed the basis for the indictments issued against eight accused members of the counterfeiting ring.

He then attempted, through a middleman, to sell the report to Joseph Spagnoli Jr., 31, of Chicago, one of the alleged counterfeiters, the government said.

Arrested with Bolden were the alleged middleman, Frank W. Jones, 43, and his wife, Jean 41, of Chicago. Jones was named by Spagnoli as the man who actually made the offer to him to sell the report. Jones is currently under another indictment on a charge of counterfeiting.

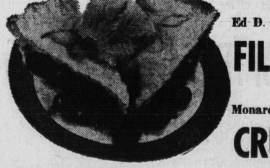

At Gagetown, Gen. Vanier will present a new battle plan to the Royal Canadian Dragoons and attend a garden party with Mme. Vanier.

Gen. Vanier and his wife will return to Fredericton by train and fly from there to Ottawa.

**Associate Status  
Is Given Support**

MONTREAL (CP) — Pierre Laporte, Quebec municipal affairs minister, said here he too believes "associate state" status for Quebec "may be the only one that can save Canada."

Resources Minister Rene Levesque called for "associate state" status for Quebec in a speech to students a week ago.

Mr. Laporte said he had made a similar comment last year and said Education Minister Paul Gelin - Laiole had spoken in the same vein Saturday at the Canadian Managing Editors' Conference at Charlottetown.

Mr. Laporte, addressing a Young Liberal Riding Association, condemned the use of violence in meeting Quebec's aims.
