

# Beef Output, Markets To Be Aired At Meeting

Two public meetings are being held by the Kings County Federation of Agriculture. A meeting last night at the Murray River public hall featured speaking on beef and mutton marketing. At the Holy Name Hall in St. Peter's on Monday evening, July 16, the main topic will be related to the crops for freeing and processing.

The achievements of this organization are so well known and so generally evident that it is almost pointless to make reference to them.

Through the initiatives of the rural women of the province have over the years made a marked contribution to its educational, social, economical, and cultural life. With the marked progress being made in these matters in- stitutions are now turning their attention to the need of changes in their programs which will deal with the problems inherent in our times. It would seem logical that more attention will be directed to farm economics, the farm business, adult education, and the implications in rural life of part time farming and outside employment for both farm men and women.

Both meetings will, in addition, have reports on federation activities and solicit views on matters related to membership and accident insurance. Finally persons present will have the opportunity of raising and discussing any problems which they consider of pressing interest to agriculturalists.

These meetings provide farmers an opportunity of exerting their influence on the organization; and, in addition, provide the opportunity of hearing reports on the work that is the Federation of Agriculture doing."

**BEFZ COMMITTEE**  
Since it was set up on April 15 the Beef Producers committee has held eight meetings of the entire committee; and, in addition, sub-committees have also met a number of times. Attendance at all these meetings has been excellent. In fact the interest shown by the committee in its job has been unusual.

Present indications are that matters have now reached the point where the committee is prepared to report to the public within the next two weeks.

Present plans are that the report will not be released until a public meeting is arranged and people given the opportunity of stating their views.

Central to the work of the committee has been the proposition that the development of a beef producing region and improvement in the degree of confidence which the cattle man has in making decisions. More specifically the beef man requires information which enables him to judge whether or not the prices which he receives are fair and whether he is obtaining the premiums which a good job entails in his returning.

**EARLY HAY**  
In general we accept the scientific belief that early cutting hay makes much better feed than the later cut variety. During the years there has been a gradual movement on the part of hay makers to move the starting date to around July 1st and away from the practice of years ago when the latter part of July was the target.

However, for those who were set to fire the starting gun or who did fire it on July 1st the weather man has taken a hand in a very conclusive manner. Hay which was cut on the second of July is still being marketed after twelve days and prospects seem to be for two weeks inter-ference in normal hay making.

Fortunately the amount of hay that was cut was small, but the delay in the starting date will to some extent this decline will be offset by increased growth and bulk.

Generally July to date has not shown even with the ample moisture satisfactory growth and lack of sunlight are reflected in slowing up the growth in all crops. Fine weather and normal heat should make a tremendous change when and if they come.

**SUNLIGHT**  
Normally July produces in the vicinity of 250 hours of sunlight. For the first five days this year 30 hours would seem to have been about it or an average of three hours per day. Rainfall is now in the vicinity of three inches which is approximately the long term average for the month. It looks as if the tap can be turned off almost any time in July.

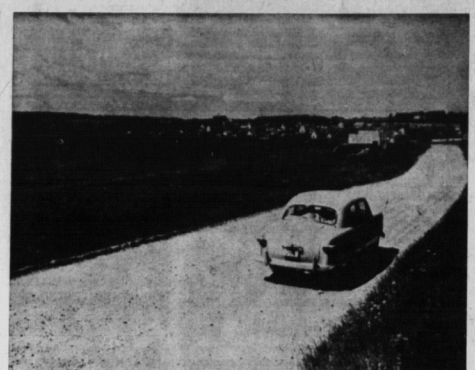
