

# Trucking Bill Thrown Out When Opposition Mounts

For the second time in as many days the local Legislature threw out a Bill designed to give added authority to the Public Utilities Commission.

Hon. Mr. MacDonald said in the beginning that he had no intention of forcing the issue, nor entering into argument with anyone on the matter.

Enactment of the Bill would create "serious changes" which might entail "serious consequences," he said, pointing out that the transfer of passengers, express and freight was already regulated by the Public Vehicle Act.
