Man Held In S'side Break

Summerside police are holding a man in connection with a break at Smallman's Ltd. and the Co-operative Super Market early yesterday morning. Broken windows in the rear of both stores which adjoin each other were discovered about 2.30 a.m. by Sgt. Joseph Linkletter while on routine patrol.

Later blood stains were found inside the windows and it is understood that the party arrested had a badly cut hand. The evening before an automobile owned by a member of the Air Force was stolen from near the garage of Mr. Willard MacDonald, First Street and was later found on Ottawa Street in a damaged condition where it had crashed into a telephone pole. There is some suspicion that the car theft and the breaks may have been performed by the same party.

As far as investigation could reveal nothing at all was taken at the Co-op Store but a .22 calibre rifle and some ammunition were taken from Smallman's department. Other articles also may have been taken. Two rocks were found inside the window of the Co-op Store and presumably they were used to break the window.

It is thought that the thief or thieves may have gone out a window of the wash room into a ledge and from this ledge broke the window in Smallman's store and entered. The arrest was made by police within an hour after the discovery of the break. Late yesterday afternoon the stolen rifle and ammunition were found where they had been thrown over the abutment at the west end water front.—S.
