S'side Athletic Ass'n Meeting

The S.A.A.A. held a special meeting at the Summerside Town Hall last night with the president, W. Chester MacDonald, in the chair. Bob Clark, vice president, acted as secretary in the absence of Jimmie Hogan who is confined to his home through illness.

Two chairmanships were filled, James Hogan being appointed chairman of hockey, and Lieut. D. Murray, of basketball. Gord Kelly was appointed chairman of a new group called the Mayor's Rink Fund committee, the purpose of which is to consider ways and means of assisting in the current drive for a new rink in Summerside. Lieut. Murray was instructed to find out about the proposed ladies basketball league for Prince Edward Island, and report back to the S.A.A.A. at its next meeting. A motion was passed to the effect that executive members who miss three consecutive meetings without good reason shall be dismissed from the executive, and reinstated only by a 2/3 vote of the body, should their case be reviewed. Considerable discussion centred around the acquiring of Johnnie Carroll's services for baseball coaching duties next summer, but no definite decision was reached.

Air School Film Shown At Summerside

"Navigators For Nato" filmed at R. C. A. F. station Summerside in May of this year by the National Film Board, was given its premiere presentation at R. C. A. F. Station, Summerside yesterday afternoon at 4:15 p.m. at a showing attended by the commanding officer, officers commanding the various training sections filmed, National Film Board representatives, and members of the press. Utilizing about one-third of the National Film Board's "Eye Witness Number 45", the Summerside part of the film, both aloft and on the ground, reviews the amazing equipment used by today's airforce to find their way through the skies. Over Canada's Atlantic coast, a natural testing ground for navigators down the ages, navigators from many Nato countries are put through a tough thirty-six week course by the R. C. A. F., ending in a colorful graduation ceremony that sends them home to their native countries as perfect examples of North Atlantic unity. Beginning with an aerial view of the big training base at Summerside, the film takes its audience behind the scenes and into the classrooms where the navigator trainees are taught various and intricate phases of navigation training. Then up into the skies where in "flying classrooms" they review the practical training that leads to ultimate qualification of being able to navigate an aircraft accurately in any part of the world. The film ends with actual scenes from a graduation ceremony at which chief of the air staff designate, C. R. Slemmon, C.B., C.B. E. C.D., in whose honor Slemmon Park was named, presents wings to a group of Canadian, British, French, Belgium, and Italian airmen in a colorful ceremony ending with a royal salute and fly-past of a formation of Harvard aircraft in a classic example of split second timing and perfect formation flying.

Lt. Defraia of the Italian Air Force, a member of this particular graduation class, will be long remembered in Summerside for his interesting art sketches of several Summerside buildings. From these drawings post cards are made, and the proceeds from their sale is used in Boy Scout work. In charge of the camera crew air station was Tom Farley, an ex-who spent several days on the R. C. A. F. pilot, and the cameraman was Wally Sutton who filmed many parts of the royal visit last fall. The film of which "Navigators For Nato" is a part, will be made available for release to all commercial theatres immediately, and in the next few weeks hundreds of thousands of people across the Dominion of Canada will be having a glimpse of Prince Edward Island's air navigation training station at Summerside, described by a high ranking officer on a recent visit as being perhaps the best navigation school in the world. Late last night it was learned that the film of which "Navigators For Nato" is a part, will be shown to the general public for the first time on Friday and Saturday of this week at the Regent theatre in Summerside.

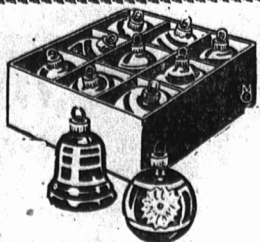

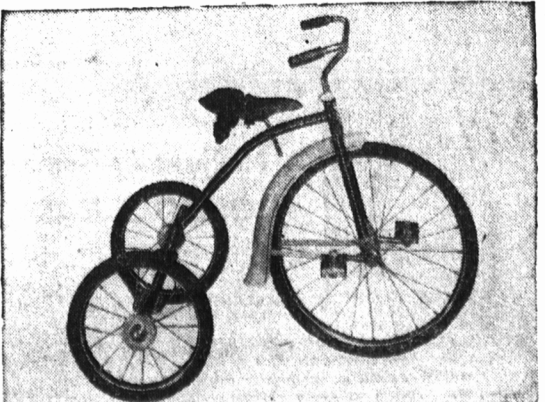
