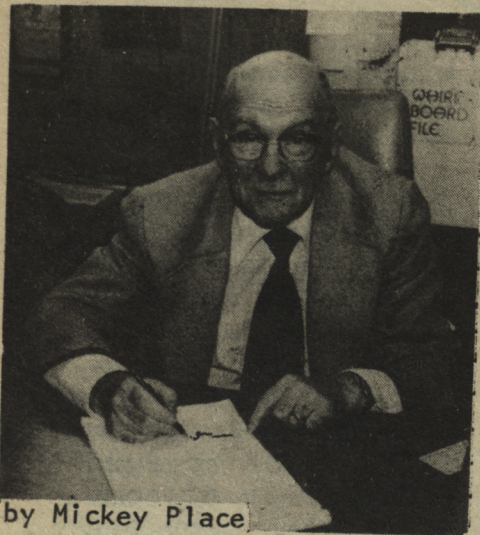


A fortnight's activity


