## Copper, Nickel Prices Discussed

TORONTO (CP) — International Nickel Co. of Canada Ltd. is not considering a copper price increase, but some change in nickel prices may be necessary eventually, Chairman Henry S. Wingate said Wednesday.

Asked at a press conference before the company's annual meeting about last week's 20-cent increase to 62 cents a pound for copper by Chilean producers, he said Inco, like almost all large private producers, feels the high price level is "extremely damaging to future markets."

If the price level continued for any length of time, he said there would be some major fallouts among users who would switch from copper to other materials.

On nickel prices, Mr. Wingate said Inco, the world's largest producer, is not thinking about a price increase at the moment.

Predicting continued growing demand for the metal, however, he said mining companies will have to make use of lower-grade ores to meet world needs.

He indicated some price increase might be necessary to make production from these low-grade deposits economical.

## CNR Forecasts

### 1966 Deficit

OTTAWA (CP) — The CNR is forecasting a deficit in its operating budget of \$25,000,000 for 1966, but a railway spokesman said this deficit will increase if labor and materials costs rise during the year.

The publicly-owned railway's operating and capital budgets have been tabled in the Commons by transport minister Pickersgill.
