WORK OF BEARS.—It is said that bears are doing destructive work in the neighborhood of Arundel, Argenteuil county, Que. Several farmers have lost a number of sheep and calves.

SNOW IN AUGUST.—One of the most remarkable things seen in this locality for a long time, writes a Lutes Mountain correspondent, is a large body of snow in a ravine. This snow is to be seen to day and bids fair to remain there until the winter.—Sackville Post.

BAD CANNED FRUIT.—Intense excitement has been caused in London by the mysterious poisoning of a score of guests of the Inn's court hotel, which, it is alleged, was due to American canned fruit. The fruit was eaten a week ago, and all who partook of it were made ill, one of the number dying. The medical certificate assigned gastric enteritis as the cause of death.

KILLED BY LIGHTNING.—A terrible tragedy occurred at St. Cloud, Minn., last week. As James Horren, of Freeport, clasped his sweetheart, Agnes Herzog, in his arms, a bolt of lightning struck them and instantly killed both. When the bolt fell Horren's lips were pressed to the girl's. They were on the front porch of her home. They were to have been married in a few days.

TROUBLE IN COLORADO.—North-eastern Colorado is the scene of a war between sheep and cattlemen. On Monday last four horsemen, carefully disguised, made into some large flocks of sheep which were being grazed along Two Mile Creek about twenty-four miles from Sterling. The men were well armed and shot and killed 150 sheep and badly crippled 25 more.

EARLY YUKON HISTORY.—An interesting story comes through the mounted police at Dawson, throwing light on the earlier history of the Yukon. It has been questioned whether the northern gold diggings were worked generations ago, either by the Hudson's Bay Company pioneers, deserters from Captain Vancouver's survey vessels, in 1792 or Russians. According to the Yukon police, there is a creek running into the Yukon river, three miles below Rink Rapids, on which extensive diggings have been found. They were presumably worked more than one hundred years ago. The location is near the creek's confluence with Tatchen river. The Tatchen is presumed to have been in prehistoric days the main Lewis or Yukon river before the water worked itself through Five Fingers and created the present Yukon. Nothing remains of the once mighty Tatchen but the bed gravel over which passes an insignificant stream. Gold is found all through this ground. The hillsides has never been prospected, but the police think these hills will at a future day, be the centre of a greater mining camp than Klondike.
