# Stock Market Suffers Worst Weekly Decline

NEW YORK (AP)—The stock market decline was market last week suffered the steepest Wednesday as prices worst weekly decline since the reacted to Britain's new austerity program designed to save the pound sterling from devaluation. The Associated Press average of 50 stocks retreated to a new low for the year as the week ended a weekly loss of 7.2 at 3134. The Dow Jones industrial average declined 29.21 to 869.15, its lowest since March 19, 1954. Brimmer was quoted in the financial press as recommending removal of the seven-percent tax credit on capital investment, and this did the blue chips no good. ## Fail To Find Walk 'Shots'

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP)—Technicians have processed more than 800 feet of movies and 360 still photographs taken by the Gemini 10 astronauts during their "space walk" but failed to find any pictures of Michael Collins' "walk" in space. Command Pilot John W. Young had said he should have taken "some great pictures" because he aimed a movie camera directly at Collins during the half-hour walk Wednesday. However, Les Gavier, National Aeronautics and Space Administration film coordinator, said that for some unexplained reason not a single frame of the walk could be found. Several feet turned out blank.

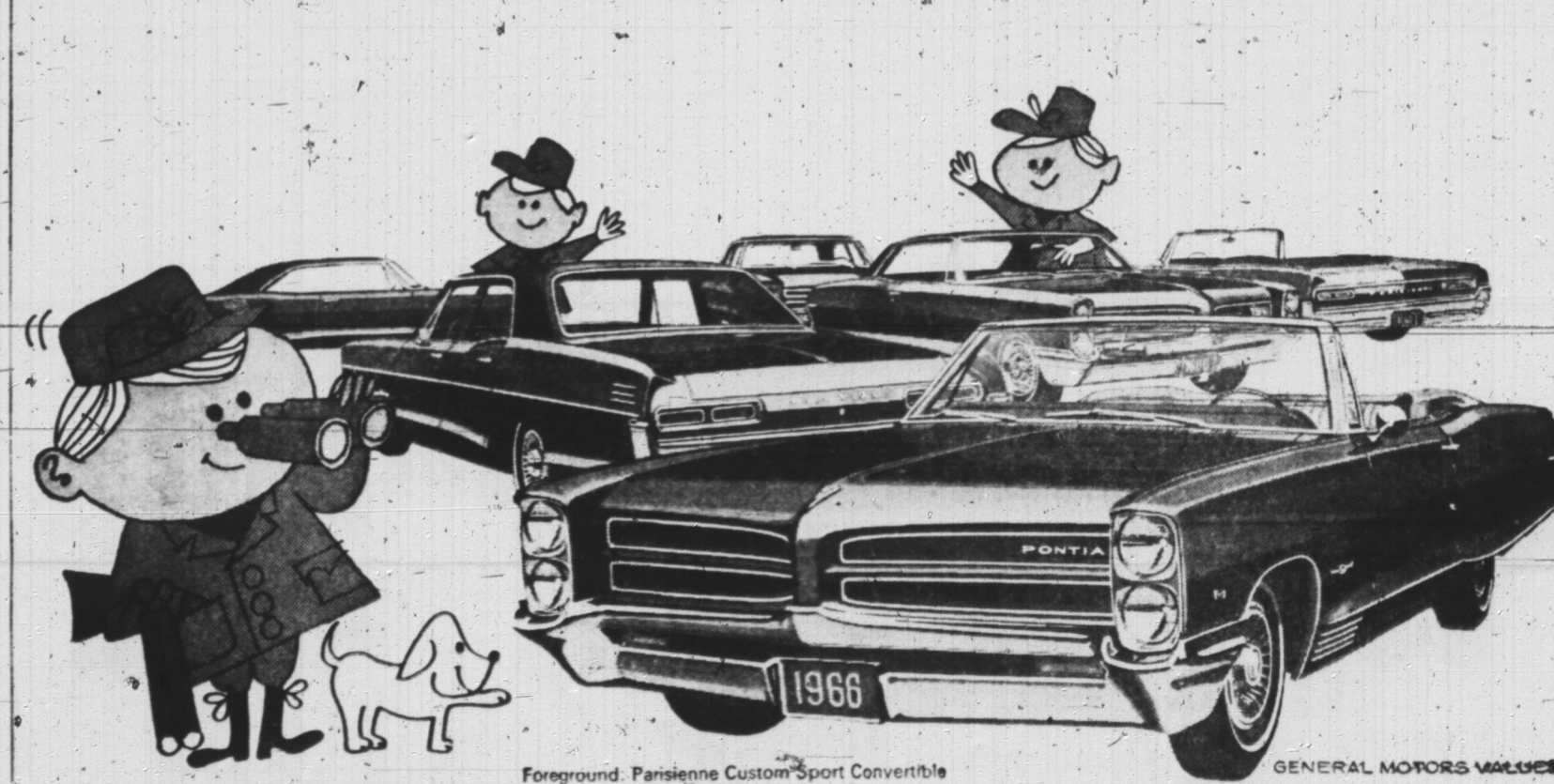
