Farmers Seek Protection When Firms Go Bankrupt

On October 18th the Canadian Federation of Agriculture appeared before the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce of the House of Commons and made representations on certain aspects of the Bankruptcy Act which appeared to be... Specifically instances of hardship had been revealed in cases where processing plants had gone into receivership with supplies of farm products on hand which were sold and the proceeds used to pay creditors while the farmer received nothing in return.

The Federation's request was that the Act be amended in such a way as to give the grower the first claim on the Company's inventory. There is considerably more in the submission but instances were related where Quebec 278 producers of vegetables lost over \$50,000 in the case of an abattoir where 70 farmers lost \$154,000. While the instances are not numerous yet they are sufficient to demonstrate the need of something additional in the way of protection of farmer products.

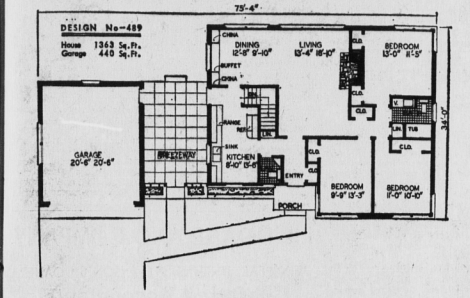
