Grain Rations To Be Boosted

NEW DELHI (AP) — About 19,000,000 persons in the worst-affected areas of drought-stricken Bihar State in eastern India will have their grain rations increased to eight ounces a day from six beginning Jan. 1, the government has announced.

The decision was taken by a special Bihar relief committee, comprising government officials including Food Minister Chidambaram Subramanian. It followed by five days an announcement that the United States would make an emergency shipment of 800,000 tons of grain and Russia 200,000.

No mention was made in the announcement of foreign aid but officials had said earlier rations could not be increased unless emergency shipments were received. Persons in some areas of Bihar have had to live on only four ounces of grain a day at times.

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CONCLUSION
Anyone who looks around and gets an interest in a particular program whether it is geese or some other phase of the poultry industry will generally find that there are opportunities in Agriculture in Poultry Production.

CONTRACT BRIDGE

Your right-hand opponent bids One Notrump and your left-hand opponent responds Three Notrump. Which card would you lead with each of the following five hands?

1. Six of spades. In the long run, a spade lead will work out better than a diamond lead. The chief reason for this is that you need less from partner in spades to develop your suit than you do in diamonds.

If partner has either the ace or queen of spades, your suit is almost sure to run as soon as you get in, while the prospect of establishing your diamonds at once is not nearly so good. In most cases, your partner would need two diamond honors in order to quickly establish your suit, and this is not nearly as likely as finding your partner with one high spade honor.

2. Jack of hearts. You have a poor hand, but don't give up just because the outlook is unpromising. Partner probably has five or six hearts, since the opponents failed to investigate a major suit game, and the best chance of hitting pay dirt is by shooting for partner's long suit with your opening club.

3. Queen of clubs. You can't

expect to lead the contract unless partner has at least one trick. You hope to win two clubs, two diamonds and your partner's trick in either spades or hearts, or, if your partner has the ace or king of clubs three club tricks and two diamonds.

The club lead can scarcely lose a trick, whereas a diamond lead might. At the same time, it also serves as an attacking lead.

4. Queen of hearts. Here you should be willing to give declarer a heart trick (he probably has the king) which he would not otherwise get, because you hope that partner will take the lead in time to return a heart and defeat the contract. The ten of diamonds lead, while ordinarily attractive with this combination is not aggressive enough. It is a "safe" lead, but this is not the hand for it.

5. Five of clubs. Here, also you should be willing to give away the first trick in the expectation of getting it back with interest later on. To stand out with the king instead of a low club will often prove fatal if partner has only one club.

You have in a same that partner has two (or three) clubs and hope that declarer cannot run nine tricks before relinquishing the lead. Only if you had a side entry would you consider starting with the king of clubs.
