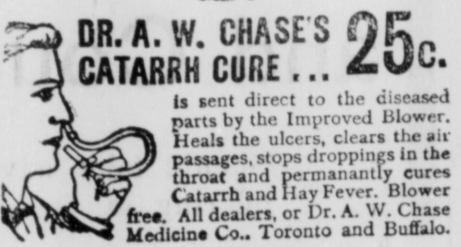

ANCIENT STONE CITY

An Interesting Discovery in New Mexico.

In excavating a number of large stone ruins in New Mexico, between Bland and Espanola, some remarkable discoveries were recently made by Messrs. George S. Cote, F. C. Cote, R. W. Bullock and G. S. Madden. The building discovered measured 560 by 490 feet. It was two or three stories high originally, but the walls are now from 6 to 10 feet high at the present time. It is probable that the upper story was opened to the sky, and upon this the dwellers spent both night and day. A remarkable find was made in a room which measured 9 feet by 12. An old furnace for smelting iron was found, near which was a large iron bar deeply incrustated with rust; also pieces of copper ore, gold ornaments, and a piece of turquoise. Twenty-five beautiful pieces of pottery were also found in the room. They were decorated. One of the designs represented the picture of a building with a smokestack and smoke curling out of it. Around the fireplace in the room which was excavated stood a dozen large pots, each with bones in it, showing that when the inhabitants abandoned the room they were preparing a meal. Baskets, iron knives, stone battle axes, musical instruments and other objects were also found. There are also estimated to be from 1,200 to 1,500 rooms in the building, only one of which has been excavated. There are said to be hundreds of similar ruins in the twenty-five miles from Bland to Espanola. This would seem to indicate that at some time more people lived in New Mexico than reside there today. Rev. Mr. Madden's theory, says The New York Times, is that about five or six hundred years ago the dwellers in that region were driven out either by an earthquake or by an invasion of a stronger race. The relics were sent to the Northwestern University at Evanston, Ill.

Electric Cars for Persia.

NEW YORK, Aug 18.—The Shah of Persia has sent an agent to this country for a brief examination of the electric trolley system of Greater New York. The Shah proposes to establish a trolley car line between Teheran and a port on the Caspian Sea, a distance of ninety-three miles.

—Surgeon Lieut.-Col. Ryerson, who has just returned from South Africa, in an interview with a press representative, said: "About two Canadian soldiers guilty of treason, the sergeant who led them into the difficulty was court-martialled and shot. The sergeant was a regular. The two privates were colonials, and got the benefit of their countrymen's gallant record."
