Local and Other Items.

DOESN'T WANT PROHIBITION. State prohibition was defeated in the Georgia Senate a few days ago. The vote was 28 to 14.

A FATAL FIRE.—A fire at Regina on Monday morning resulted in the death of three sons of constable Saunders, whose house was destroyed. Their mother barely escaped.

BURNED TO DEATH.—Mrs. Susan Brooks, aged 75, who lived alone in a house on King Street, Carleton, St. John, was so badly burned on Sunday that she died in the hospital next day. She was working about the stove when a lamp exploded and set fire to her clothing.

BURGLARS AT TRURO.—The large meat shop of McKelzie & Sons, at Truro, was entered by burglars on Sunday night. After getting into the store they drilled through the safe and successfully used explosives to open it. The cash-box was taken, which containing about \$60 besides papers.

A NARROW ESCAPE.—The Summerside correspondent of the Guardian says: What came near being a serious accident occurred on Tuesday forenoon at the railway crossing, near the east end of the town. A lady and gentleman were driving in from the country when their horse became frightened and backed up against the approaching train. The lady jumped out just as the carriage was struck, the gentleman was thrown out, both escaping unhurt. The carriage was but slightly damaged.

CANADIANS TO THE FRONT.—The Canadian contingent has been ordered to Modder River with other reinforcements for Lord Methuen's forces. Their career will be watched with great interest in the United States as well as in Canada. Some of the young men in the command marched in Rochester on the fourth of July, and showed good military training. In all probability there is no better material in the British army. Under able and reliable officers, the contingent will doubtless distinguish itself.—Rochester Democrat and Chronicle.

TRANSVAAL SOUVENIR BOOKLET.—We have received a copy of a Transvaal Souvenir booklet recently published in St. John by Mr. A. M. Belding of the St. John Sun. The booklet is most tastefully gotten up in every way. A CRUEL DISAPPOINTMENT.—A short time ago a fine company of volunteers was organized in Summerside, and it was the intention to send two of the number to the artillery school at Quebec this winter, in order, by a course of practical training, to fit them for the position of instructors. The company was organized under excellent auspices, and, from its personnel, gave promise of becoming one of the finest in the service. A few days ago, however, official intimation was received from headquarters that it was not the intention of the Militia Department to increase the forces at present and consequently no equipment was forthcoming. This will of course result in the disbanding of the corps, to the great disappointment and indignation to the volunteers themselves, and the citizens generally. In this connection it would look as though our representatives in parliament had no influence whatever with the government if they support, else they would surely have been able to secure the proposed volunteer company the official sanction and encouragement of which the movement was deserving. The disappointed volunteers should not forget this phase of the matter when election day next comes round.—Summerside Journal.

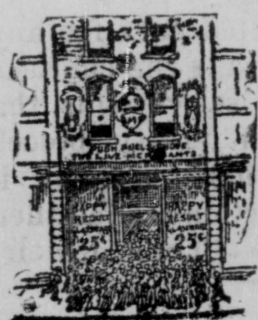
