CHINESE BUILD WALL
TAIPEI, FORMOSA (AP)—A Berlin-type wall is being built by the Chinese Communists along part of China's border with the Portuguese colony of Macao, the official Chinese Nationalist central news agency reported Wednesday. The agency quoted unidentified persons who arrived in Macao from the South China province of Kwangtung as reporting several thousand persons are working on the wall, apparently designed to stop Chinese from fleeing to Macao.
