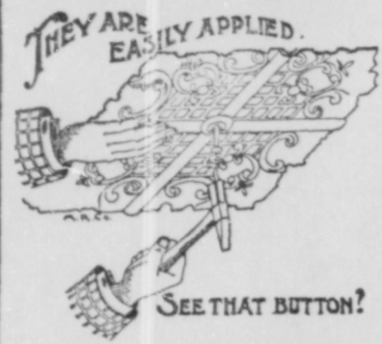

Local and Other Items.

BUILDING WARSHIPS.—The French naval budget committee reports that the battleship Charlemagne, the cruiser Disaster, four torpedo boat destroyers and 25 torpedo boats be completed within the year 1899, and that two battleships, one cruiser, two gun-boats, 14 torpedo boat destroyers, a submarine torpedo boat and turbine boat be added in 1901.

BRITISH NAVAL MANOEUVRES.—The British naval manoeuvres this year will involve a test of torpedo boat destroyers against torpedo boats, and an attempt on the part of a supposed enemy to intercept a convoy of provision ships coming from Canada to Britain.

THE WORLD'S MEET.—Great preparations continue to be made for the World's Bicycle Meet which takes place in Montreal, from July 7th to 12th. The "Athletic News," an authority on sporting affairs, published in Manchester, England, says that Tommy Simmersgill, the Leeds champion, and also amateur champion of England, will represent England at the races.

SANK INTO THE GROUND.—A curious accident took place at Victoria, B. C. on Saturday. A block of buildings, 80 by 60 ft, being the cleaning and washing department of the Scotch-Canadian cannery sank below the banks of the Fraser River. The building was built on piles now believed to have found a foundation in quicksand. No one was hurt, luckily, and no machinery of importance lost. A gang is hard at work building again, though, of course the old material is swallowed up.

NOR LONG ENOUGH.—Major General Hutton has many times drawn attention to the inadequate period of 12 days' training. In a recent militia order, he says: "It is folly, however, to suppose that a satisfactory military training can be given in the short space of twelve days. Military training, if it is to bear satisfactory results, and to satisfy the conditions of an effective military force, must take place at fixed and regular periods, and in the conditions pertaining to Canada should extend over at least sixteen days."

BANQUET AT BAYFELD.—On the eve of departure for Alberta, Mr. John A. McPhee of Bayfield, Kings County, was tendered a banquet by a large number of friends, about sixty guests sitting down to the repast provided for the occasion. When the toast of the evening, "To our Guest" was proposed, the chairman, Mr. A. J. McIntyre on behalf of the assembled company presented Mr. McPhee with a very flattering address to which he briefly replied saying that he could not forebear a pardonable pride at seeing so many friendly faces round about him on the eve of his departure and that the scene of his leaving-taking would be indelibly imprinted on his memory. He left for the West on Monday, the 17th inst.

Crisis in Belgium.

LONDON, July 25.—A Central News despatch from Brussels says that a ministerial crisis has arisen over the franchise question, and several of the members of the Ministry have offered to resign.

Celebrated Actress in Debt.

NEW YORK, July 25.—Rose Coghlan, the actress, filed a voluntary petition in bankruptcy in the clerk's office of the United States District Court under the name of Rosamond Maria Sullivan. Her petition places her liabilities at \$50,836. The only assets named are necessary wearing apparel, "also a theatrical wardrobe, consisting of a few dresses, wigs, etc.," all valued at \$250, and claimed to be exempt. About \$15,000 of the indebtedness is in judgement.

Trouble in India.

BOMBAY, July 25.—There is trouble on the frontier growing out of a quarrel between the Khan of Nawagai and sections of the Mahmunds. A battle was fought on Friday, in which 100 men were killed and 150 wounded. The Mahmunds were victorious.

Three Negroes Lynched.

BAMBRIDGE, Ga., July 25.—A negro captured near Iron City, and who was identified as one of the assaulters of Mrs. E. Oglevee last Thursday night, was lynched near Safford. Two other negroes who were arrested at Troy on suspicion of being implicated in the outrage, were found dead.

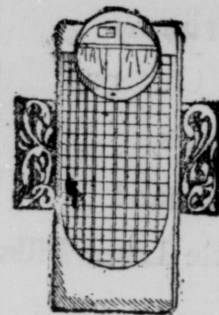

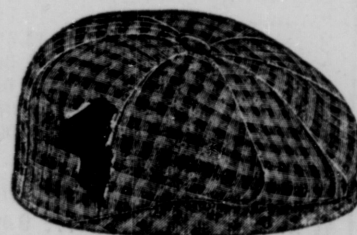
