'Islander' In Maine Sees Film Of P.E.I. On 100th Birthday

Centenarian Louis J. Rix had one wish that meant a great deal to him but it almost bordered on the impossible—he wanted to visit his native province of Prince Edward Island while he was still alive.

Not being in the best of health the trip to the province was out of the question. A member of his family explained the circumstances to officials of the Travel Bureau here and Prince Edward Island was sent to Mr. Rix at South Gardiner, Maine on film.

The travelogue was obtained from the National Film Board here and shipped by the Travel Bureau on loan to Mr. Rix in time for his 100th birthday this month.

The former Islander was born at Cape Wolfe, P.E.I. and has resided in the U.S.A. for 70 years. The film "Abegweit" was shown to him on his birthday by his grandson, Bernard R. Faunce of South Gardiner.

Though changes were in evidence everywhere during Mr. Rix's long absence from his home province, it is understood that the excellent color travelogue went a long way toward satisfying his yearning for one last look at the province of his birth.

Mr. Rix worked as a millwright in a Skirvin paper mill in Berlin, New Hampshire until, as he stated, he made a mistake splitting wood and lost his leg. He has worn an artificial leg since he was 54. He continued at mill as watchman until he retired at the age of eighty.

To what does the former Islander attribute his longevity? "I say my prayers every night before going to sleep and I think that has something to do with it," he explained in an interview with his home town paper. His father and mother lived to be 75 and 80.

Mr. Rix has two sons and two daughters, five grandchildren and ten great grandchildren. His birthday cake the middle of this month had ten candles, one for each ten years of his life. He has been described as a remarkable man, alert and well read.

Large Building (Continued from page 1) noticeable in the departments of industry and natural resources and of fisheries. These, under the leadership of Hon. Leo Rossiter, are located in building on the corner of Great George and Sydney Streets.

HEALTH CENTRE — Largest of them is the department of health which took over the former Polyline on Prince street several years ago and since has expanded greatly in an annex built within the centre of the block bounded by Prince, Kent, Fitzroy and Hillsboro streets.

Included in the structures are offices of the minister of health, deputies, pathologists, provincial health officer, veterinarians, sanitary engineers, general offices, libraries and a variety of laboratories.

The old Post Office building purchased from the federal government several years ago, now houses the motor vehicle branch, and the departments of education and public works and highways. Until this week the main part of the building was the temporary home of the Royal Bank of Canada. That section recently vacated is now available to the government.

The department of welfare with its various directorates is housed in the old customs building at 40 Great George street while the department of agriculture is jammed in the second and third floors of the Provincial Building Annex which once was the Bank

Island Turkeys Are Selling At Lowest Prices In Years

Prince Edward Islanders this Christmas will have the cheapest turkey dinner they have had in years.

Island turkeys are retailing at 43 cents per pound dressed, while imported eviscerated turkeys from Western Canada are selling in the stores for 49 cents per pound.

One retailer said Tuesday that the only thing that will keep Island birds on the market is the loyalty of the people to buy locally raised stock.

The 43 cent price this year is 20 cents less than last year. The price drop is credited to the strong competition being offered by the eviscerated turkeys which are becoming increasingly popular with Island housewives.
