Voice of the campus

If anyone has taken the time to listen to any of the local radio stations, they would soon find out that they are slightly limited in their selection.

Not only are there not many stations to choose from, the few that there are all seem to show the same amount of lack of taste and seem to be totally absorbed by be-bop bubble gum music. There is quite a void left that could be easily filled by the universities radio station.

One of the main problems with CSUR, found at 700 on your A.M. dial, is that it can't be picked up once you are farther than one hundred yards from the University. Reception in the new residence wasn't even possible till this week. If one is within the limited distance though, they will find that the radio station is doing some very innovative things this year, though the majority of the programming is the same as you would get on any local station.

One of the things worth taking note of is a six hour blues program every Monday night between six and twelve. Blues have been played on CSUR on rare occasions in the past, but never have they had a regular time for such as presentation. The show is handled by Kip Puia and Brian Kingston and known as the Double K production.

CSUR has also made an attempt to carry more student affairs over the air. Every away football and hockey game will be broadcasted by the radio station. In addition they have set up a campus news

system, with an eleven person staff that broadcast campus news twice a day at 12:15 and 5:15. They also plan on doing 24 hour live shows during events on campus such as Fall Festival.

The station is also working with an exchange system with other stations. Any special shows of interest, by other stations will be played on CSUR, such as the hour long special they had two Saturdays ago on immigration.

CSUR has live programs between 8:00 p.m. and 12:00 p.m. every day with taped

shows between 12:00 p.m. and 3:00 a.m.. In the event that a D.J. doesn't show up, a tape of one of his past shows will be played.

The majority of the time is programed, though they can still use anybody with some good ideas who would like to work for the station.

A late note:

I would just to make mention of Mia Andersons' performance this evening of Ten Women, Two Men and A Moose. It was a brilliant display of excellent acting from a wonderful selection of Canadian Poetry and Prose.

The play, having not been attended by a large number of people, led to a beautiful intimacy between the actress and the audience.
