MR. PATRICK MCCARVILL

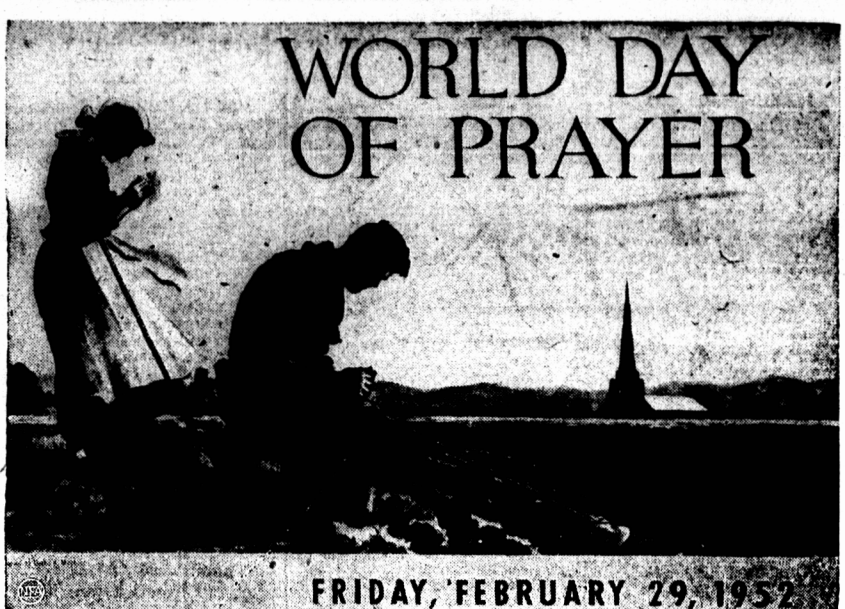
