H.M.S. Adventure Leaves Malta For England

LONDON, June 11—Britain's first cruiser-mine-layer, H. M. S. Adventure, is returning from Malta for reconditioning. The Admiralty announced last night. The mine-layer, which originally had a flat stern but was rebuilt to her present shape in 1932, is expected to reach Devonport Dockyard June 14.

The Admiralty also announced that the battle cruiser Repulse, which was built during the war, was enroute from Portsmouth to the Mediterranean after refitting at a cost of \$7,000,000. The repairs will greatly increase the efficiency of the 32,000-ton battle cruiser.

H. M. S. Renown, of the same class as the Repulse, is about to undergo repairs at a cost of about \$3,600,000.

BELOVED OLD HYMN HAS MISSING VERSE

There is a missing verse to the well-beloved hymn, "O God of Bethel," Rev. Dr. B. Banks Nelson, informed the Presbyterian General Assembly.

"Few people know there is a reference to the title in the hymn 'O God of Bethel,'" Rev. Dr. Nelson said.

"For a short time I was blind. 'O God of Bethel' was a great comfort to me. As I dwell on words of the hymn, I recalled it was written as a paraphrase of Jacob's vow. But it seemed incomplete. There was no reference to the title. When I was in Scotland later I looked up the original manuscript of Philip Doddridge in the 300-year-old museum in which it is stored. There was an extra verse that is not on the currently known form." Dr. Nelson recalled the missing verse as follows:

To These as to our covenant God
We our whole selves resign,
And count that, not our tent alone,
But all we have is Thine.

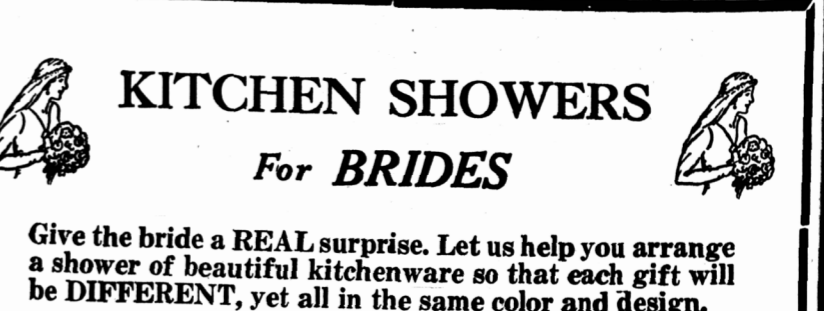
