## Local and Other Items.

**DR. CARMAN'S DENIAL.**—A story is afloat in Toronto that money subscribed by Toronto Methodists for the aid of St. James' Methodist Church, Montreal, was given with the proviso that unless the full amount required was subscribed the money should go to the twentieth century million dollar fund. Dr. Carman says there is no truth in the report.

**A FATAL ACCIDENT.**—An exchange reports that Mrs. W. G. Mitchell, mother of W. F. Mitchell, well known throughout this province on account of his connection with the Gould Bicycle Co., met a sad death recently. Mrs. Mitchell caught her foot in her skirt while walking down stairs in her home in Guelph and pitched headlong almost the entire stairway. She was taken at once to a hospital, where an operation was performed, but died within five hours of the accident. The deceased lady was 54 years of age.

**UNCOMFORTABLE EXPERIENCE.**—During the thunder storm of Monday night Mr. and Mrs. Rufus Carter were driving near their home at Maccau and had an uncomfortable experience with the lightning. One bolt seemed to strike the horse, staggering him and blinding the occupants of the sleigh, and a minute later another flash was seen in front of the horse, almost paralyzing him and causing him to leave the road. However, beyond a shock to Mrs. Carter no serious damage was done.—Moncton Times.

**RADCLIFFE REFUSED SHELTER.**—Radcliffe, the harem, undertook the task of seeding Canada with Sam Purlow's sterility for the murder of Isidore Poirier, did not meet with a cordial reception in the village of St. Scholastique, where the double hanging took place. All the public places of entertainment refused to give him accommodation and private houses were much less inclined to take him in. The people of the village are exclusively French-Canadian, and the carpenters who erected the gallows there eighteen years ago have been frowned down on ever since, as the people are of a superstitious nature, and looked upon money earned in such a manner as Judas money. Radcliffe was compelled to go to Montreal to get shelter.

**THE POPE'S GIFTS.**—The value of the various personal gifts to Leo XIII., says a writer in an English Journal, is estimated to be equal to at least £1,000,000. The splendid jewels he received at his recent jubilee included twenty-eight tiaras, 319 crosses set with diamonds and other precious stones, 1,200, chalices in gold and silver, eighty-one rings, of which the one given by the Sultan (fancy a Turk representing anything but a scimitar to the Holy See) is worth £20,000, sixteen pastoral staves of gold, set with precious stones; seven statues in gold and silver; as well as the largest diamond in the world, valued at £300,000, which was presented by Oom Paul. The objects d'art in the Vatican are counted by thousands, and are of the greatest value. Also has few, if any, poor relations, so doubtless these treasures will go to the Mother Church. By the way, Count Camille Pecci, grand nephew of the Pope, and commander of the Guardia Nobile, is about to visit Canada on private business.

## DONALDSON'S DIVE TO DEATH

The World's Champion Meets With a Mishap.

New York, March 11.—Thos. Donaldson, known the world over as the champion high diver, dived from the roof of Madison Square Garden, a distance of 85 feet, with probably fatal results. He has been making two dives daily. The tank is less than 8 feet deep and on two or three former occasions Donaldson did not have the success expected but came out of the water with hemorrhage from the nose and ears. Three thousand persons saw the diver leap from a platform and falling slowly forward make the plunge. He shot straight downward, but it was plain before he had gone half the distance he had lost the control of his body. He struck the water head first and failed to come up. Small circles of blood came bubbling from the bottom and Harry Reely, the amateur swimming champion, plunged into the water. Finally Donaldson was brought to the surface apparently dead, with blood flowing from his mouth, nostrils and ears, and wounds on his head. He was removed to the New York hospital with a fractured skull with compression of the brain and the left side of the face in a crushed condition. The surgeons say death is only a question of hours. It is said that he did not have his wits about him when he struck the water. Donaldson weighed more than 250 pounds and struck the water with terrific force. He is 45 years of age.
