

# Macquarrie Gets Mention Of Post

**OTTAWA** — If the liberals win on Nov. 8, they will have no problem choosing a speaker for Canada's 27th parliament.

Lucien Lamoureux, the young, fluently bilingual lawyer from Cornwall, who served as Deputy Speaker in the last house, is certain to be given the post.

A more popular choice would be hard to find, spokesmen for all parties are agreed. Mr. Lamoureux established a solid reputation for fairness and for deftness in handling touchy situations during his hours in the chair.

In fact, if the Liberals win, prime minister Pearson may make another effort at agreement on a permanent speaker, with Mr. Lamoureux as first appointee. Several things stand in the way, including the fact Mr. Lamoureux is believed to have eventual cabinet ambitions. And his years as executive assistant to former Liberal minister Lionel Chevrier may rule him out in the minds of some older opposition MPs.

If the Conservatives win, their choice will be more difficult partly because they are not as endowed with bilingual members. Ability to speak and understand the two languages is now almost a must for the speaker's post.

One name mentioned is Heath Macquarrie, the member in the last house for Queens, P.E.I. But it is not 100 per cent certain he will be re-elected and, if he is, he is not bilingual. Also, he has been somewhat critical of party leader Diefenbaker and is unlikely to get the nod on that ground.

The Conservatives will likely turn to one of their Quebec members and so maintain the tradition of alternating French and English Speakers. Two possibilities are Paul Martineau and Theo Tizard, providing they are re-elected.

Meanwhile, Speaker Alag Macnaughton carried on although he is leaving the political field to return to his lucrative corporation law practice in Montreal. The rules provide he remain speaker until a new one is elected by the Commons on the first day of the new parliament.

The extra \$10,000 a year speaker's indemnity is scrupulously divided. Mr. Macnaughton is paid until noon on the first day of the new parliament and his successor collects the other half of that day's pay.

Islanders and mainlanders alike took advantage of the last long weekend before winter sets in resulting in what was thought to be one of the heaviest Thanksgiving weekends as far as traffic is concerned for the two ferry services.

A spokesman for the CNR said that the Borden - Cape Tormentine run had full loads every crossing all week-end and that the Confederation made an extra round trip on Friday, Saturday and Monday nights.

The Abegweit, which makes all-night freight runs, took passengers on a number of trips in order to clear up waiting traffic.

Captain Claude Hunter said that two extra trips were made on Saturday and Monday on the Wood Islands - Caribou run. He said that the traffic was fairly heavy all week-end and very heavy from both sides Monday afternoon.

The weatherman treated Islanders with a little warmer temperatures for the weekend. On Saturday the average temperature was 57.4 and on Sunday 51.6. Temperatures recorded before nine o'clock last night ranged from 51 to 44.9.

On Saturday no rain fell and the wind was gusting to 25 mph. Rain fell on Sunday, 1.31 inches of it, and the wind was from three to 12 mph. Yesterday was overcast and 25 inches of rain fell before nine o'clock with the wind ranging from calm to 15 mph in the same period.

The rain forced cancellation of yesterday's racing card at Summerside.

## Camera Crew Filming By Air

A five man team arrived on the island Friday to film the Prince Edward Island portion of "Helicopter Canada".

"Helicopter Canada" will be an hour-long feature film of Canada, in color, in Panavision, with background narration, dialogue and sound effects.

It will be the first full length motion picture feature to be filmed in its entirety from a helicopter in flight.

It is being made by the National Film Board and with the aid of the Canadian Centennial Commission and it is believed the team will be here until today.

Eugene Boyko, the NFB top camera man, sits on the right of the 'chopper' with the door removed, trapped to his seat and his camera with the world before him... and his lens.

Mr. Boyko, who was once a taxi driver in Vancouver, B.C. and first became a photographer for "Fields of Sacrifice" a memorial film on Canada's dead

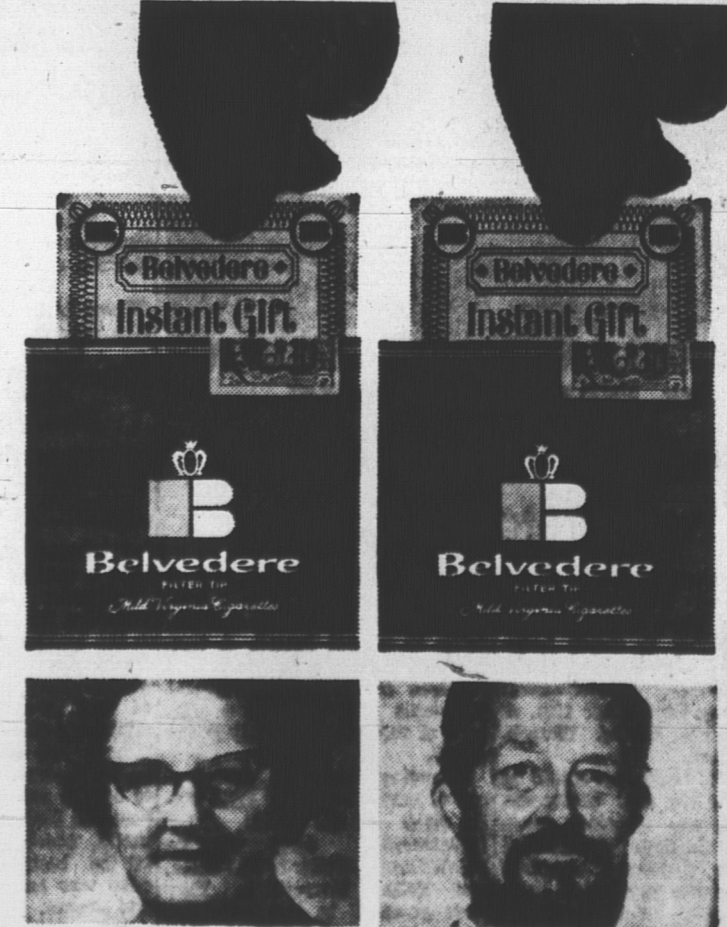
