DEBT OF CANADA.

The net public debt of Canada at the end of the last fiscal year was \$241,131,434. Although the great permanent works of the canal at Sault Ste. Marie and the canal at Saugoune are being pushed forward and heavy payments have been made on account of them, the increase of the debt to the end of the year was only \$548,538.

REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE.

DETAILS OF THE REVENUE AND EXPENDITURE OF THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA HAVE BEEN PUBLISHED IN THE CANADA GAZETTE. The account shows, as announced in THE EXAMINER a few days ago, a clear surplus of \$1,386,579. The total revenue for the year is as follows:—

Customs \$20,933,700
Excises 8,334,247
Post Office 2,773,508
Public Works, including railways 3,760,436
Miscellaneous 2,299,610
Total \$38,131,701

As compared with almost any previous year, this is a satisfactory showing. Every item of revenue shows an increase. Customs, \$452,641; excise, \$389,149; post office, \$120,762; public works, \$195,463; and miscellaneous, \$51,808.
