1) The Rodes Scholarships: Valued at 3,000 (pounds). The scholarship is open to any Canadian or British subject over 19 years of age and under 25 years of age. The candidate must have achieved academic training sufficiently advanced to assure completion of a Bachelor's degree by Oct. 1, 1977. Literary and scholastic attainments; fondness of and success in outdoor sports, qualities of truth, courage, devotion to duty, sympathy for and protection of the weak, kindness unselfishness and fellowship are all characteristics taken into consideration.

Scholarships and bursaries are available for graduate study. Each week there will be a list in the Cadre and on CIMN. Information is available on financial aid, as well as more information on the following scholarships at Student Services. As the closing dates for most scholarships is before Christmas, it is necessary to make application soon.

#### 1) Lord Beverbrook Scholarship

A representative from University of New Brunswick, Alan M. Sinclair, will be interviewing applicants for the Lord Beaverbrook Scholarship for Law on the morning

#### 2) Bell Canada Fellowships:

Valued at \$3,500. Preference is given to those applicants whose disciplines which are relevant to the scientific, political, social and economic needs of Canada. Fellowships are available for 12-month periods beginning in the academic year in which they are awarded, and are tenable anywhere in Canada.

#### 3) Gulf Oil Canada Limited Graduate Fellowships:

Valued at \$4,500; \$3,500; \$1,000. Fellowships will be awarded to candidates in business and management studies, computer sciences, mathematics, geology, geophysics, engineering, physics, chemistry, ecologically-oriented studies, and other sciences related to the petroleum industry. Tenable anywhere in Canada.

#### 4) MacKenzie King Scholarships

Valued at \$3,000. Candidates should be engaged in the field of International or Industrial Relations (including the international or industrial aspects of Law, History, Politics, Economics).

#### 5) Rhodes Visiting Fellowship

The candidate will receive an allowance of 2,312(pounds) per annum, in addition to board and lodging and the initial and terminal expenses of travel to and from her country of residence. The candidate is required to undertake research in Arts, Science or Social Studies.
