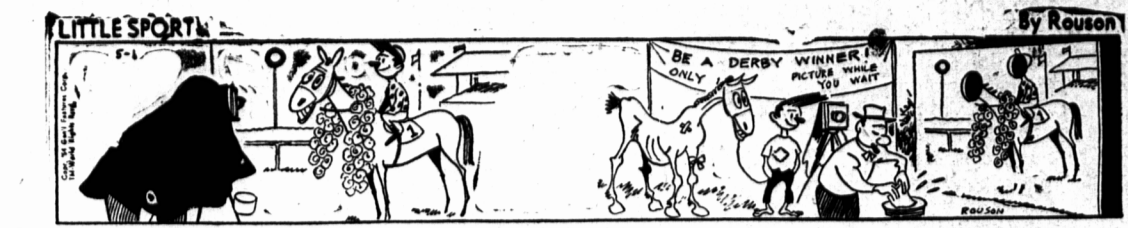

Trotters Win City League Hoop Title In Thrilling Game With Nomads At SDU

The Sport Lodge Trotters edged H. C. Atkinson's Nomads 46-44 last night after three overtime periods of basketball to win the City Basketball League Championship in a dramatic wind-up to the League's operations.

The score was tied 38-38 at the end of regulation time last night. In the first overtime period Irving MacKinnon scored two points for the Trotters and George Scantlebury scored a basket for the Nomads.

MacKinnon connected on two foul shots in the second overtime session while Rolie Diamond and George Scantlebury picked up single points to knot the count at 42-42. A second before the period ended Howatt fouled Scantlebury as the latter raced in to shoot. The Nomads team leader rimmed the basket on both tries but failed to score.

One minute after the third overtime period started Earl Nicholson hooked home a basket from ten feet out. Rolie Diamond and Gayle MacDonald scored on foul shots to tie the score again.

Walter LePage broke up a play in the Nomads end to start the series of plays which led to the Trotters victory. Nicholson and Scantlebury fought for the ball on the line and from the resulting jump Nick tipped to Howatt who scored.

Veeck Has Plan For Major Ball In Los Angeles

LOS ANGELES (AP)—Bill Veeck said Friday he has nearly completed a new plan to bring major league baseball to Los Angeles.

Veeck, representative here of Chicago industrialist P. K. Wrigley here to expedite the establishment of big-time baseball in Los Angeles said he hopes to have within three weeks "the framework under which Los Angeles' entrance into the majors could be made in an orderly and intelligent way."

The plan, he said, would include help from some government agencies. He didn't say which ones. However, he added that in other major league cities help was obtained from city and county governments and from park boards.

He said "I won't even hazard a guess as to when major league ball could be played here." Wrigley Field, home of the Los Angeles Angels of the Pacific Coast League would be the playing site.
