Massey-Ferguson declined 1/2 to 32 and traded 30 1/2 shares. Quebec Natural Gas unchanged at 1 1/2 but traded 16,841 shares. Anheuser-Busch A and Walker-Goodman gained 1/2 at 38 1/2 and 38 1/2. Selco gained 1/2 at 38 1/2.

TO FIGHT EXPULSION

Australian champion swimmer Dawn Fraser leaves her Sydney home Tuesday with the statement that "I'll not take this lying down," as her first public reaction to a 10-year expulsion from the Australian Swimming Union imposed Monday. The penalty was given for her appearance in opening ceremonies in the Tokyo Olympics and wearing of the wrong suit in her races. She set all women's world spring swimming records in the meet. Three other Australian girls were banned for shorter periods. Dr. Donald Dowling, ASU President, said action of the four in marching in the opening ceremony was one of the reasons.
