## Local and Other Items.

**MISSIONARY ADDRESS**—A missionary address will be given in this city by Dr. Annie Young, on Tuesday, August 29th.

**WORTH REMEMBERING**—The Charlottetown Business College and Writing Academy opens on the 29th inst. See ad in another column.

**HARVEST**—Harvest is in full swing throughout the province. In a few exceptional cases the rust has affected the grain but the crop is large. The weather has been all that could be desired.

**THE RUSSIAN WAY**—The fifth commandment, according to the official Russian revision, now reads: "Honor thy father and thy mother, the Emperor and his officials, that thy days may be long," etc.

**TEA AT ELDON**—There will be a tea at Eldon village on Thursday, the 24th inst, in aid of the Baptist Church of that place. People from town who want to enjoy a pleasant day should arrange to drive down to this tea.

**FISH**—The Carqueet fleet of codfishers are very much in evidence these days on the north-western shores of the Island. Bait is scarce and fishing on that account is slack. But the season has only commenced and the prices are away up.

**DRIEST ON RECORD**—This has been the driest summer on record in England. Only 191 tons of water per acre has fallen instead of the usual acreage of 610 tons. For 25 days the thermometer registered a temperature of over 80 degrees.

**COAL OIL DID IT**—At Freeport Village, a few miles south of Berlin, Ont., last Friday night, Mrs. Watson started a fire with coal oil when the can exploded, setting her clothing on fire. She rushed out and rolled in the grass in a vain attempt to smother the fire. The woman lingered in terrible agony till next morning, when she died. She leaves seven children the youngest two months old.

**ANOTHER PATRIOT REWARDED**—The appointment of Dr. C. D. Rinfret, M.P., for Lotbiniere to the position of inspector of inland revenue for the Quebec district, rendered vacant by the retirement of Sir James Lemoine, on superannuation, makes the fifth vacancy in the House of Commons. The vacant seats are: Winnipeg, Sherbrooke, Vercheres, West Ontario, and Lotbiniere. The salary of Inspector of inland revenue at Quebec is \$2,400 a year.

**A HALIFAX SPRINTER**—Halifax people are deeply interested in the recent fine performance of Frank Stephen, the fast sprinter of the Wanderers. Stephen recently went 100 yards in a shade better than even time. Right on top of his performance he ran 220 yards in 23 seconds. Today Stephen leaves Halifax for Boston to take part in the American championships on the 26th. Stephen's chances for a place in the finals of the big sprint races are good, and he may take a championship back to Halifax. Halifax has sent out some fine athletes, but never one better than Frank Stephen.

**CHASTIZED HIS BABY**—The Cincinnati Enquirer says: Monroe Hodges, aged 106 years, of Anderson, Ind., who whipped his eighty year old son Hiram at Indianapolis and placed him in the hands of surgeons, who sewed his scalp together, and are trying to bring him to, lives in a little house in Irondale addition. He claims the distinction of being the man who drove the first spike on the first railway ever constructed in Indiana. His ninety-nine year old wife died recently. His strength and mental activity are something marvellous. Hiram was one of the babies of the family, and he is eighty years old.

**INSOMNIA DRUGS**—There has been published in detail by Dr. J. B. Learned, of Northampton, Mass., his simple method for the treatment of insomnia, the whole thing being accomplished without the usual resort to drugs. Briefly, muscular and mental exertion, in a systematic way, is the course involved; that is, a series of positions of the body, lying upon the back and side in the normal line, with the brain being occupied in controlling and making changes, is the substance of the remedial measures proposed, the brain being occupied in devising these changes and modifying the respirations—thus calling blood and vital energy away from the centre of matter that keeps up the automatic motion and prevents sleep. The doctor terms this "turning off the bells." The muscular motion consists in fixing a certain group of muscles for a definite length of time, and then another and another change. Fatigue soon comes to muscle and brain thus controlled and sleep is inevitable.

—The return of the public debt to 31st July shows the total to be \$344,980,390 as against \$338,148,193 on the same date last year. The assets at present are \$81,397,135, leaving the net debt \$263,583,255, an increase of \$3,538,176.

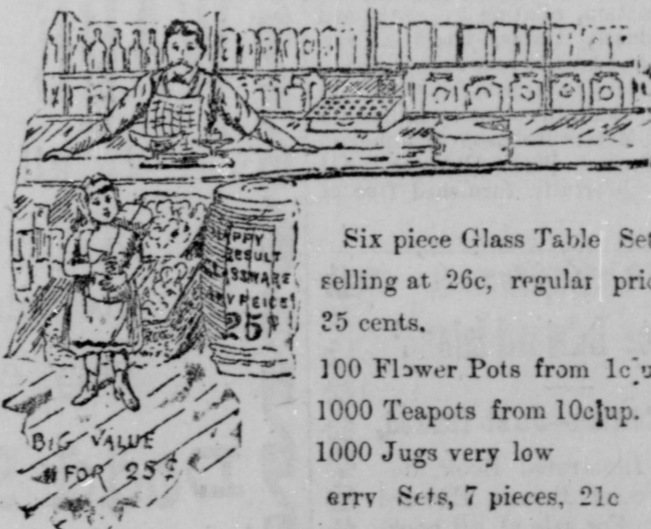
