

# Legislature Is Given Answers To Questions

The following written questions were submitted by various members during the current session of the P.E.I. Legislature to which replies have been given by the ministers concerned.

The following questions were submitted by Arthur MacDonald (L-5th Kings):

1. How much was spent on research on fisheries in the fiscal year 1964-65 in Prince County, in Queens County, in Kings County?

2. How many boats were employed in fishery research for the year ending March 31, 1965, in Prince County, in Queens County, in Kings County?

3. From what harbours did the boats operate, in Prince County, in Queens County, in Kings County?

4. How many men were employed by these boat owners, in Prince County, in Queens County, in Kings County?

5. Were these boats hired by contract?

6. If answer to No. 5 is "Yes," were tenders called?

7. What was accomplished by each boat operation in the way of information gained?

8. Were the owners of these boats bona fide fishermen?

9. How many fish (in CWT's) were landed by each in July, August, September, October, November?

10. To whom did the proceeds from the sale of fish go?

11. Where were the fish sold?

12. What was the condition of the fish when landed?

13. What methods of catching fish were used?

14. Was each successful? If "Yes," to what degree?

15. (a) What species of fish were caught? (b) How many CWT of each kind were landed in Prince County, Queens County, Kings County?

16. What was the average sea time per day?

ANSWERS from Minister of Fisheries:

1. Before attempting to answer the question No. 1 by the Honourable Member from Fifth Kings I must explain that Fisheries Research is principally carried out by the Federal Government. The role of the province is mainly supplementary to that of the Federal Government within whose jurisdiction fisheries have been vested by the British North America Act.

While I can supply the Honourable Member with the amount of money which is spent by Provincial Fisheries on development and promotion, I must point out that the amount on fisheries research fundamentally would be but a part of the gross figure. I must also point out that we would be unable to supply the amount for the fiscal year ending March 31, 1965, since a great many accounts are outstanding not only at this time but for some period after March 31 in order to finalize certain projects.

As near as we would be able to single out fundamental fisheries research from the broad category of development and promotion, this year \$1,000.91 is the amount expended to this February 1965. For the fiscal period ending 31st March 1964 the total expenditure in the many areas of interest under development and promotion was \$65,143.21. Of this amount, about \$3,700 was expended on pure research.

This would answer Sub-Section 1 of the question of the Honourable Member from Fifth Kings. In answer to Sub-section 2, we must report that no boats were employed in fisheries research during this period. This means that all the following sub-sections of the Honourable Member's question, numbers three to 16 inclusive, are not applicable.
