handbill on the library system to all homes has evoked many comments and enquiries at the various branches.

With so much emphasis placed on supplementary reading in the school curriculum it is gratifying to report that in the past year almost every school on the island received at least one collection of library books.

Visual Education

During 1951 the film library circulated 10,000 films to a total audience of 131,000 people. This represents 2400 separate programmes throughout the Province.

During the tourist season 18,500 tourists saw selected programs of travel films at 230 separate showings.

The efforts of the staff are now being directed toward self operation of film programmes by communities and the proper utilization of visual materials.

Teaching Service

As in the other Provinces of Canada, the problem of providing an adequate number of properly trained teachers continues to be a difficult one.

Library facilities were again available for the people of Alberton and vicinity with the opening of their attractive new library building during the year.

Programme of Studies

Revision of the programme of studies has continued to receive attention. As in the previous year much of the time of the Assistant Director of Education was devoted to curriculum problems.

Looking backward over the past year, we have much to be thankful for. Divine Providence has been kind and our first thoughts should be of gratitude for the bountiful harvest from land and sea.

Looking forward, let us do so with a confidence based on past experience, hard work and thrift.

May all our people greet the New Year with faith and hope and determination to make the days ahead a blessed period for all of us.

ectors of the Canadian Education Association at its 1947 conference spent two years studying the "teacher shortage" crisis and its causes.

One paragraph from this report is here quoted to indicate the thinking of the committee following a study of the data collected from all provinces of Canada: "Teaching as a profession is relatively unattractive as a life's work."

At the time of writing there are in the Province three schools, having sufficient children to operate, without teachers, while in 77 classrooms teachers are at work under permit.

During the school year 1950-51 the number of pupils enrolled in the public schools was 18,468, an increase of 189 over the previous year.

Several staff changes took place since the previous year. Miss Vera Simpson, Miss Margaret Gould, Miss Ann Duffy, Mr. Ian Ashford, Mr. Ivan Dowling, Mr. Robert LeClair left the staff.

Principle of Wales College this year has a registration of 485 students distributed as follows: 198 in first year; 140 in second year; 57 in teacher training; 58 in third year; and 20 in fourth year.
