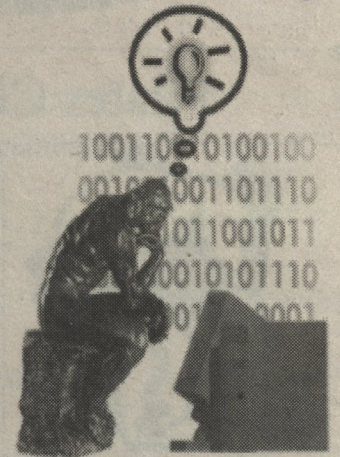
"I should start doing that!" Rockwell remarked at the chance to eat more discarded food.
