New Flag Pole At Legion Home

The Charlottetown branch of the Canadian Legion has added much to the appearance of its Home by painting it white with green trimmings. A new flag pole has also just been placed in position, the base of which is one of the two 40 pounder rifled, breech loading Armstrong guns which did duty on the range at Tea Hill in the latter part of the last century.

The following is taken from the Daily Examiner of the 26th of April 1889. "The two new Armstrong breech-loading rifle guns, with carriages and full equipment, which arrived here on the Princess of Wales on Wednesday last, are for the Artillery Brigade of Queen's and King's Counties. These guns have come direct from England for the sole use of the Brigade. There are only five of these guns in the Dominion. The Island has a goodly share."

For two or three years Inspecting Officers had urged that the Island Brigade be equipped with guns of this type on account of the efficiency of the Brigade. So two of the first five guns arriving were sent to the Island.

The following is a very brief account of the target practice, which was probably the last, with these guns, which took place on Saturday the 7th of July 1900, when the guns were hauled from the City to the summit of Tea Hill. The targets were placed about 300 yards off the beach at Squaw Point and at a distance of 3000 yards from the guns. The targets represented forty five men kneeling, and received a bad pounding from the first of the four batteries. Lieut. Colonel Moore, D.O.C. was Umpire, and Lieutenant McDougall was Range Officer.

The other old 40 pounder, with its carriage still in a fair state of preservation is at the Ordnance Grounds. This gun should be mounted on a concrete base by either the Provincial or Civic authorities, as it is not only a reminder of the efficiency of our Island Artillery, but is a link between the old muzzle loader and the modern breech-loading guns.

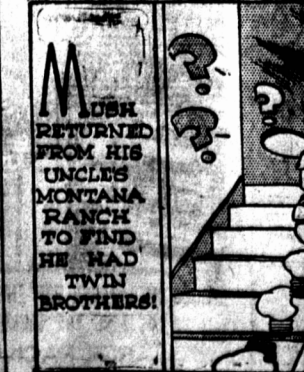
