Thirty - Five Island Beauties To Bid For Sea Queen Title

SUMMERSIDE — Thirty-five contestants will be engaged in the Sea Queen contest to be held during the 4th annual Lobster Carnival at Summerside this week.

A Sea Queen and two princesses, who will receive a total of \$600 in cash and wardrobe awards, will be chosen from the contestants on the basis of appearance and personality.

The girls, in formal dress, will make their first public appearance at preliminary judging of the contestants at carnival headquarters in the Summerside Stadium on Wednesday evening.

On Thursday they will be seen together again on a large float in the Lobster Carnival parade during the afternoon, and again Thursday evening when a queen will be chosen, and prizes presented to her and the two princesses at the stadium.

On Friday evening the contestants will make their fourth and final appearance as a group during the coronation parade and the crowning of the Sea Queen at the stadium.

On Saturday evening the queen will preside at the presentation of prizes to winners in the various other carnival competitions.

16,000 West Berliners Leave City Since April

By REINHOLD ENSZ BERLIN (AP) — A superficial look at West Berlin leaves the impression that the city's 2,300,000 people are not in the least worried about what will happen at the Geneva foreign ministers conference.

But a responsible city official's calculations show that more than 13,000 West Berliners have abandoned the city since November, when Soviet Premier Khrushchev launched his drive to oust the West.

At first look, downtown West Berlin is bustling and throbbing as never before. Million-dollar office buildings are rising. The streets are torn up by a \$47,000,000 project which will add five miles of tunnels to the subway system. Unemployment is down to less than 55,000. The lowest figure in West Berlin's record.

"Nothing will happen as long as they keep on negotiating," or "It's too hot to think about politics."

MANY HAVE LEFT But if you probe deeper, city officials will admit that one of the big reasons for the drop in unemployment is that thousands of persons have left, to find a more secure future in West Germany.

Although office buildings are being constructed, private home building has diminished to the vanishing point. Said one architect:

"I know of no one who is starting to build a house now. My business has disappeared and I'm going west."

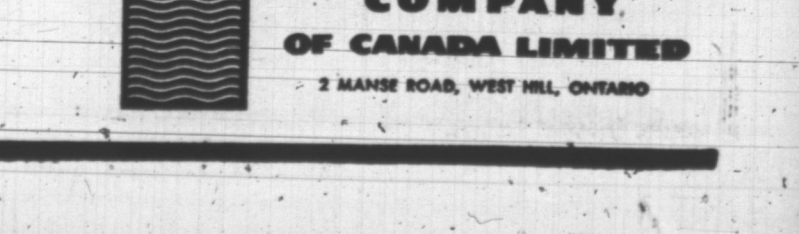

Eight pretty girls in various stages of undress galloped over Berkshire's moonlit downs in Britain's least decorous derby. But only Clare and one other dressed down to the limit.

As enforced by two watchful bobbies, this was a form-fitting, flesh-colored, one-piece bathing suit.

Earlier, Clare had held out for the real thing — a race worthy of Coventry's legendary lady who took everything off to help the poor.
