5 Socreds Deny Pamphlet Report

QUEBEC (CP)—Five of six men who as Social Credit MPs pledged their support to the Liberals following the 1963 federal election denied at a press conference here that any outside influence had influenced their decision.

They also denied that they received any money in return for their promise of support.

The men were commenting on a pamphlet published Wednesday by Dr. Guy Marcoux, Social Credit member of the last Parliament and now an independent candidate in the Nov. 8 election. The pamphlet gave what Dr. Marcoux described as the background of a manoeuvre which enabled the Liberals to take office following the 1963 election which ended in a near stalemate between the Liberals and the Conservatives.

The pamphlet said the step taken by the six led John Diefenbaker, Progressive Conservative prime minister, to resign and paved the way for the governor-general to invite Liberal Leader Pearson to form a new government.

INVOLVED DOYLE

Dr. Marcoux said Transport Minister Pickersgill and mining promoter John Doyle, described as a personal friend of Liberal Premier Smallwood of Newfoundland, took part in a deal which led six Social Credit MPs to pledge their support to the Liberals.

This was not so, said Gerard Perron, one of the six and now a Creditiste candidate for re-election in Beauce. He told the press conference that he and Gilbert Rondeau, member for Shefford and a Creditiste candidate for re-election there, had

planned the declaration of allegiance.

Four of their colleagues had decided to go along with them—Pierre Andre Boutin, Dorchester; Raymond Langlois, Megantic; Lucien Plourde, Quebec West; and Robert Beaulieu, Quebec East.

All but Mr. Rondeau attended the press conference. Also there was Gilles Gregoire, chief lieutenant to Creditiste Leader Real Caouette and a candidate for re-election in the Quebec constituency of Lapointe.

Mr. Gregoire denied that Mr. Pickersgill, Mr. Smallwood or Mr. Doyle had played any part in the decision of the six to support the Liberals.

PLAN LIBEL SUIT

Mr. Gregoire said the six members who signed the statement of allegiance and himself plan to sue Dr. Marcoux for libel after the election. The suit would be delayed because court action now would prevent public discussion of the affair and also the men involved did not want to be tied up in court while the election campaign is in progress.

Mr. Gregoire did not disclose on what grounds his personal suit would be based. One passage in the pamphlet said that Mr. Gregoire and Mr. Caouette both knew that the six members planned to support the Liberals. Mr. Gregoire told the press conference he learned of the decision of the six from a television news broadcast.

Mr. Perron said the decision to support the Liberals was reached to block a plot aimed at bringing about a coalition of the Conservatives, the NDP and the Social Credit.

with the pledge to support the Liberal party. The pamphlet said the statement of allegiance was prepared in Montreal by Hubert Ducharme, described as lawyer for Mr. Doyle. Mr. Perron told the press conference the document was prepared by Mr. Rondeau, the member for Shefford. The pamphlet said that the statement of allegiance was sworn to before Moise Darabaner of Quebec City in his capacity as a commissioner of the Superior Court. Mr. Darabaner now is before the Quebec courts on a series of charges of fraud and arson and conspiracy to commit fraud and arson.

MET DARABANER

Mr. Gregoire said that Mr. Darabaner was at the motel where the six met to discuss the statement of allegiance. He was playing cards there with Alexandre Bertrand, former vice-president of the Social Credit party, and was introduced to the six, who did not know who he was.

But Mr. Darabaner was not present when the six discussed the statement of allegiance.

Only Mr. Bertrand was present when the statement was sworn to before Mr. Darabaner after the six had signed it. The six subsequently reversed their decision at Mr. Caouette's request, but the Liberal government had already taken office. Mr. Perron said Mr. Caouette had not been informed beforehand about their decision to support the Liberals. "It would not have been pro-

dent to advise him, and we were in a hurry." Later in 1963, Mr. Caouette split with the Social Credit party and formed the Quebec based Ralliement des Creditistes, taking 12 of the 20 Quebec Social Credit members with him. The six members mentioned in the pamphlet by Dr. Marcoux all are Creditiste candidates in the Nov. 8 federal election under Mr. Caouette's leadership.

CNR Contracts For 300 Cars

MONTREAL (CP)—CNR has awarded three contracts for 900 freight cars valued at a total of \$13,500,000 to be built in Nanaimo, Ont., Hamilton and Vancouver, Ont., it was announced here. On order from International Equipment Co. Ltd., of Montreal, are 300, 30-ton steel flatcars 62 feet long which will be built at the firm's Nanaimo, Ont., plant. Vancouver Iron and Engineering works Ltd., will build 400 piggyback flatcars. Three hundred heated and in-

ulated steel boxcars have been ordered from National Steel Car Corp., to be built at its Hamilton plant. Delivery of the flatcars will begin in January, 1966, and the boxcars will start rolling from assembly lines in April, 1966.

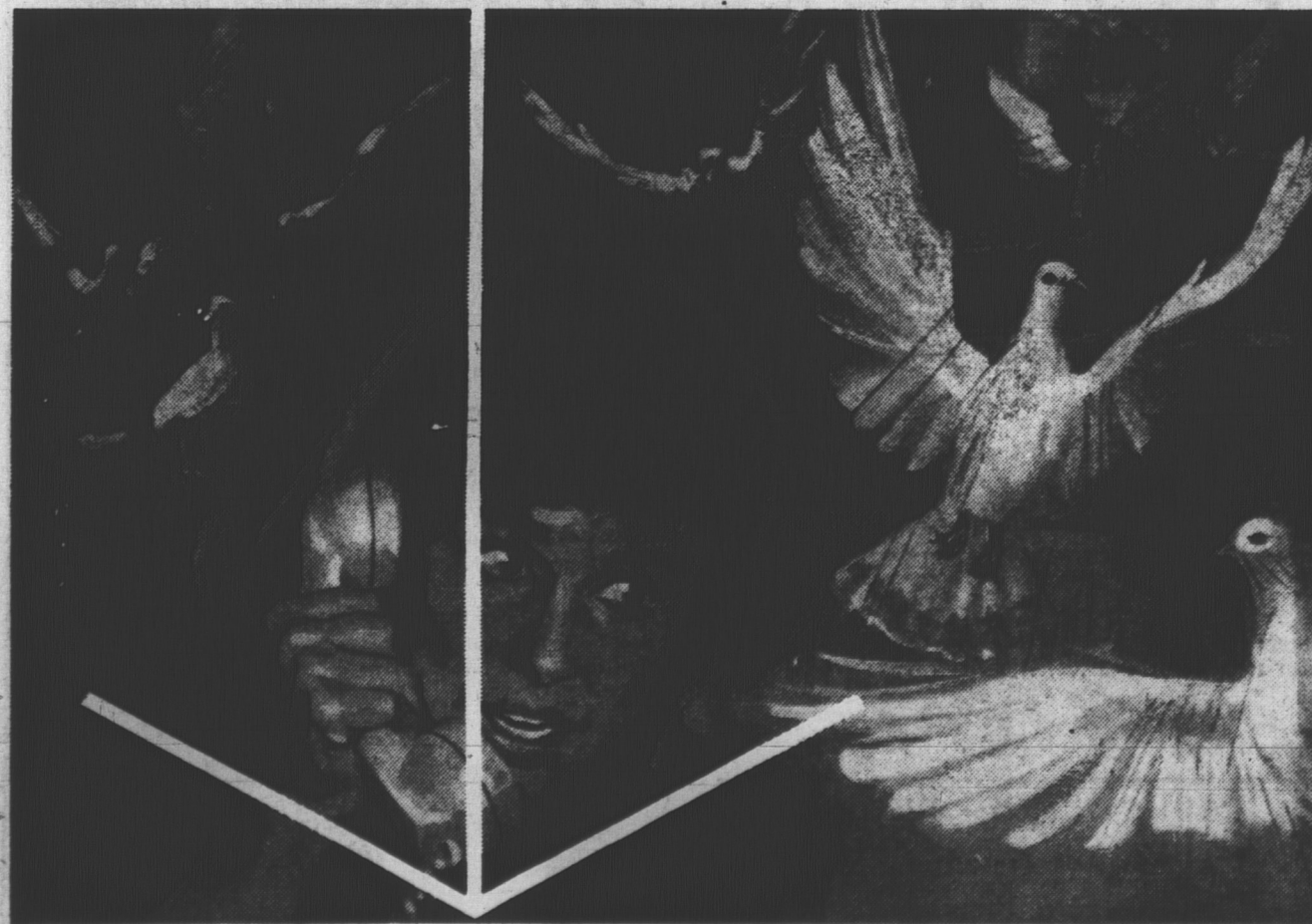
