THE LADY NAIRO.—A New York despatch says: Barque Lady Nairo drifted with heavy ice and flood-tide across the bow of the German barque Caroline anchored off Quarantine at 9 p. m., on the 6th. A tow-boat hauled the Lady Nairo to an anchorage. She carried away her foremast and mainmast. The Caroline received no damage. The ice is very heavy all along the Staten Island shore.

GOLDEN JUBILEE.—This being the year in which His Holiness Pope Leo XIII. celebrates the golden jubilee of his episcopate, His Lordship Bishop Macdonald has ordered that a solemn Te Deum in commemoration of the event be sung in all the churches of this diocese on Sunday next, 19th inst. In St. Dunstan's Cathedral a sermon appropriate to the occasion will be preached by Rev. J. C. McNeilan, and His Lordship Bishop Macdonald will give the Papal Blessing.

REMOVAL OF A BIG LUMBER COMBINE.—The St. John Sun has been informed that a scheme is being quietly promoted for the purchase of the lumber lands of the province by a combine of the leading lumbermen, and that it will be introduced as new lumber policy of the local government at the approaching session. The lumbermen have taken the hint from the Nova Scotia coal deal and are now said to be pressing their views upon the executive.
