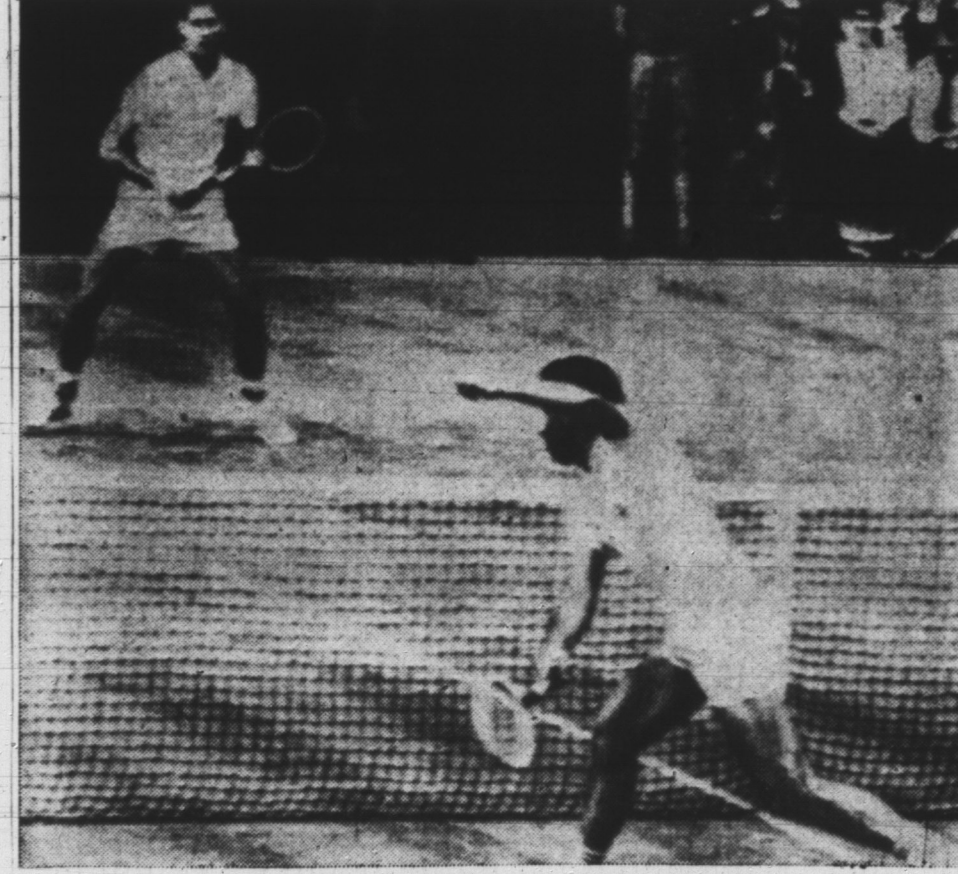
HUNTERS' CORNER
Game Warden Application Useless Without Action

The position of Provincial Game Wardens, three of them, have been advertised in the local press. Its a move in the right direction but it could be 'too little and too late' unless I note where applications for them are given a free hand with respect to prosecutions. It's a certainty that such appointments should be under a Game Commission and exempt from political interference. At the moment our wildlife, with specific reference to waterfowl and upland game birds, is at the whim of any shotgun toter who happens to see them. For instance - On Wednesday of this week two ladies went for a walk along the shoreline at Langley, across the river from the City, the pleasure of their stroll was shattered when they came upon a body of a freshly killed Canada Goose on the shore. It was quite apparent that the goose had been shot within the hour for rigor mortis had not set in although the heat had pretty well left the body. Fresh blood stains were observed on neck and breast. No gunshots were heard by the ladies in question and they had been at the shore for an hour or longer. It is apparent that the goose flew a considerable distance from the point where it was shot and wounded. If wildgeese were left alone during their spring sojourn with us we would have them nesting here in this province in considerable numbers. As is two instances of Canada geese nesting here have been reported this spring. Naturally their received rigid protection from the owners of the property where the nests were located. Our ducks and geese are under enough pressure without being subject to poaching-forays during the nesting season. Our water fowl are under enough pressure from natural causes during their nesting and brood rearing period without being subject to the inroads of a certain class of gun toters whose motto appears to be: "It's a live - kill it". Here is a case in point: On Wednesday evening of this week two angling friends of mine were out on a dam trying their luck on trout. They heard a mother black duck flapping in the water, and squawking, an approximate one hundred yards distant. The trout were in a co-operative mood and they paid no particular attention for a minute or two. When it continued with unabated volume they reeled in their lines and rowed to the spot. As they neared the scene of the apparent trouble a mother black duck took wing and flew away. On reaching the exact spot from whence the apparent trouble existed all they saw was the sweetest little black duck you ever looked at. It was only a few days old and sitting motionless on a patch of blue water among the flag greenery. As they watched the darling little creature and wondered what had caused the commotion a minnk-rose from under water, like a trout taking a fly, and took the little duck in its mouth. It swam ashore in a matter of seconds and disappeared into the bushes like a brownish flash. The minnk knew they were watching and pulled a 'submarine stunt'. Nature in the raw can be tough and there is no point in we humans making it any tougher than necessary. We must learn to limit our lake in the sporting realm or we may kill the goose that lays the golden egg.

Santana Outwits Ralston To Cop Wimbledon Crown

By **GEOFFREY MILLER**, WIMBLETON (AP) - Spaniard Manuel Santana out-maneuvred Dennis Ralston of the United States 6-4, 11-9, 6-4 in a classic final Friday and brought the Wimbledon tennis title back to Europe after 12 years.
 The grinning 26-year-old won the crown, the world's most coveted tennis prize, with a blend of power and subtlety that made him a popular hero with the 15,000 fans.
 As the drama rose to its climax in the close and torrid atmosphere of Wimbledon's centre court, Ralston's nerve failed him and he fell into double faults and volleying errors.
 Santana kept going steadily with spin and drop, stop-volley and smash, and finally won in three straight sets.
 At the end Santana was given the most emotional reception any Wimbledon champion has received since Czech born Jaroslav Drobný, who was the last European to win the title back in 1954.
 He stepped forward, laughing with happiness, to accept the big silver trophy from Princess Marina, aunt of Queen Elizabeth, and the entire crowd stood and cheered.
 Saturday's major attraction on the centre court will be the bid of Billie Jean Moffitt King of the U.S. to defeat Maria Bueno of Brazil for the women's singles title.
 A beautifully played job from the 23-year-old Ralston in the first set had Santana scrambling back in vain at his baseline. That shot took the American to 40-15 on Santana's service. But the Spaniard recovered and won with an ace.
 One game later the scales began to tip for the first time. Ralston double faulted and trailed 15-30. Santana seized his chance and took the next point with a forehand pass and then complete the first break-through with a forehand that left Ralston groping in mid-court.
