**Oil Officials Visit Well**

SUMMERSIDE - Several noted oilmen arrived here Friday to make their first inspection of operations at the Imperial Oil Company Ltd. well at MacDougal.

Included in the group were several company officials together with chairman of the Alberta Conservation Board and an executive member of the Canadian Petroleum Association.

By Friday morning the depth of the well had reached 4,700 feet, a gain of 80 feet over the previous day.
