"This is a real tragedy," Donald Rosell, a representative of the U.S. Aid Mission in Viet Nam, said Wednesday.

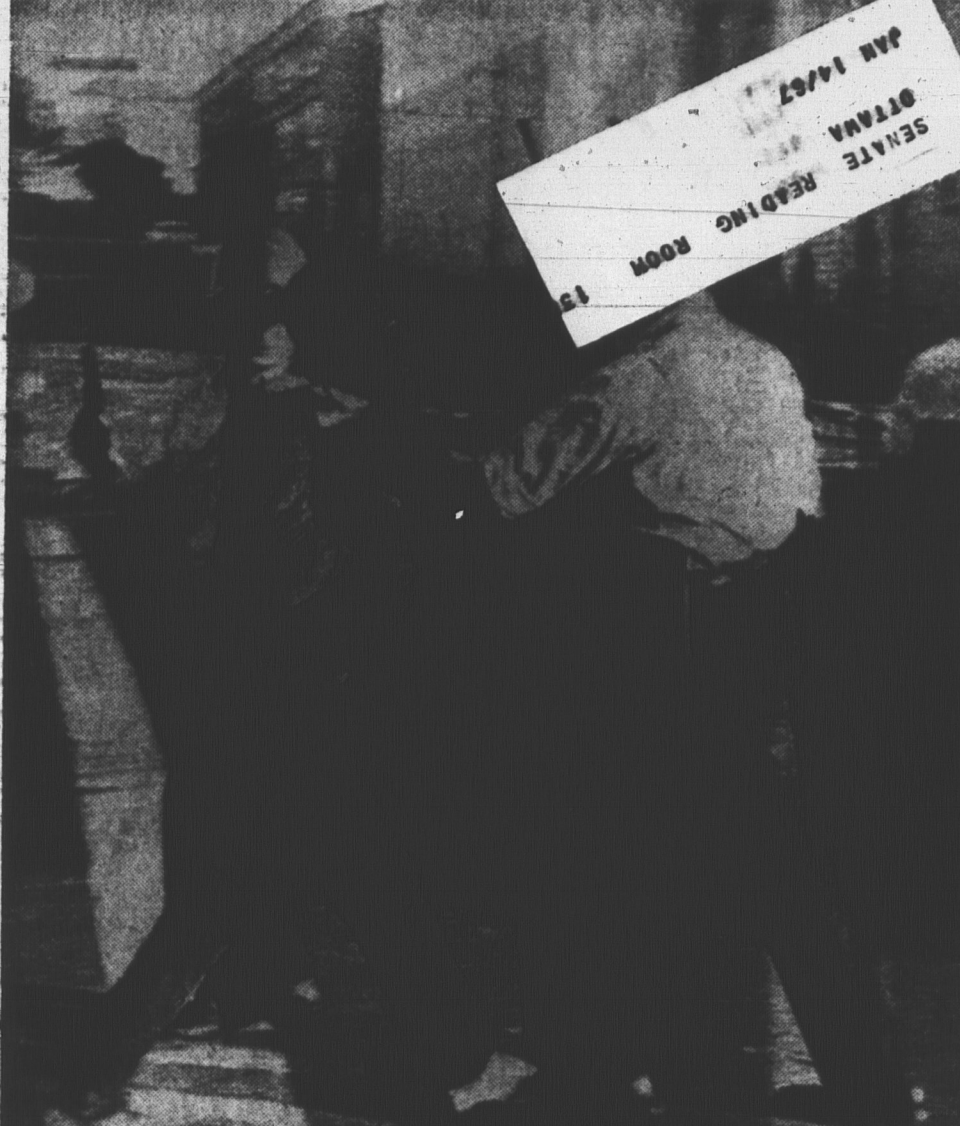
As Americans sought to help the bereaved survivors, the U.S. pressed air attacks on northern targets.

GREAT DISASTER FEARED

Inez Aims Growing Fury At Small Dominican Town

SAN JUAN, Puerto Rico (AP) — Hurricane Inez, which has claimed at least five lives, whipped herself into a monstrous storm Wednesday with top winds of 150 to 175 miles an hour and aimed her fury at a sleepy southern seaport town in the Dominican Republic.

REPORTS ARE SKIMPY — The big damage from Inez was on the seven islands of French-owned Guadeloupe where she barreled from the Atlantic into the Caribbean Tuesday.

The valley behind the Dominican town of Barahona leads directly to the Haitian capital of Port au Prince.

A storm this strong comes along only once every four or five years and strikes land even less often.

The French overseas ministry in Paris said roads, bridges and homes were damaged.

Coastal residents in the Dominican Republic were urged to seek the safety of high ground and secure buildings.

The storm growing stronger by the hour was expected to smash directly over the town of Barahona (population 20,000) about daybreak.

LOST 2,000 IN 1939 — The last time a major hurricane struck the Dominican Republic's southern coast, in 1939, about 2,000 persons were killed and much of the capital city of Santo Domingo was levelled.

Anglican Joins Call For Peace

VANCOUVER (CP) — The leader of the world's Anglicans has joined the Pope's call for peace in Viet Nam.

Dr. Michael Ramsey, Archbishop of Canterbury, told a capacity crowd of about 1,600 Tuesday at Christ Church Cathedral:

"I join my voice wholeheartedly with the appeal the Pope has made that in this coming month Christians everywhere pray, and pray urgently, for peace in Viet Nam."

Dr. Ramsey, speaking on unity, said Christian churches should regard themselves as allies, not rivals.

Montreal Wanted Pair Arrested Picketing UN

NEW YORK (CP) — Two men responsible in absentia last week at a coroner's inquest into the death of Jean Corbo, a 16-year-old student who died July 14 when a bomb he was carrying apparently exploded prematurely outside a Dominion Textile plant here.

Five other young men were also held responsible for the death.

Earlier last week the two were also held criminally responsible along with six others for the death of Therese Morin, 64, who died in a bomb blast at a Montreal shoe factory May 5.

City police identified the pair as Charles Gagnon, 27, and Pierre Vallieres, 28. A police spokesman said the two, who were carrying placards on behalf of the Quebec Liberation Front when arrested, distributed an announcement in the UN Press Gallery Tuesday that they had started a hunger strike which they would end only with achievement of special status for imprisoned members of the Quebec Liberation Front.

The CIB spokesman said these later were changed to warrants for non-capital murder by the Montreal police court.

The CIB spokesman said Vallieres and Gagnon will be arraigned on non-capital murder charges when they are returned to Montreal.

In Montreal, a spokesman for the Criminal Investigation Bureau said that Gagnon and Vallieres will be returned to Montreal the next few days.

Pearson Urges Discretion In Rhodesian Issue Debate

OTTAWA (CP) — The 12th conference Commonwealth Parliamentary Association opened Wednesday with a call by Prime Minister Pearson to the Rhodesian assembly to keep things in perspective.

Black African delegates had earlier promised attacks on the white-supremacist Rhodesian regime.

Mr. Pearson said he knows the subject will receive attention at the conference because it bears on the survival of the Commonwealth.

Aid Sought To Avert CBC Strike

OTTAWA (CP) — CBC negotiators and those of the technicians decided Wednesday to seek assistance from the federal labor department in an effort to avoid a strike that could hogtie corporation operations from coast to coast.

Restraint Is Advocated To Sustain Growth Rate

OTTAWA (CP) — The first meeting of the Commons-Senate committee on living costs was told Wednesday that Canada has to learn how to live with prosperity.

R. B. Bryce, deputy minister of finance, said the country will not sustain the growth rate it established in the first half of 1966 through the rest of the year, but there still is good long-range growth potential.

The fact the gross national product rose only 1.6 per cent between the first and second quarters of 1966 was not bad in itself. There had been an unusually strong upsurge earlier which the country could not have expected to maintain.

No country, including the United States, has yet been able to moderate a boom into a long period of sustained prosperity and this is what Canada and the U.S. are trying to do.

Mr. Bryce pointed to a "surprising and, I suggest, important" stability in the division of the GNP between labor and capital costs.

He noted that wages, salaries and fringe benefits made up 50.1 per cent of the GNP last year. That figure has not varied more than a few tenths of one per cent since 1950.

Mr. Bryce said that alone shouldn't be branded as culprits. There have been major increases in total spending by individuals, companies and governments.
