Rotarians Hear Addresses On Liquor, Express Service

Fulfilling an obligation required under membership, two Rotarians spoke briefly at the weekly luncheon in the Charlottetown Hotel yesterday on their classification.

Both speakers professed their remarks with appreciative references to their acceptance in Rotary. "Having conceived a favourable impression of the organization through press and radio accounts of work on behalf of crippled children and other community projects it became a source of satisfaction to be granted membership."

"Beverages - liquor distribution - my classification" he continued "stems from the fact that the government of P.E.I. controls the sale of intoxicating beverages on the island and they in turn appoint a commission known as the P.E.I. Liquor Control Commission who are sole agents who can import or export spirit, beer or wines into or out of the province. The enforcement of the Act comes directly under the authority of the Attorney-General's department.

The speaker told of the importation of wine from South Africa, Australia, France, Germany, Spain and Italy in addition to the domestic supply from Ontario.

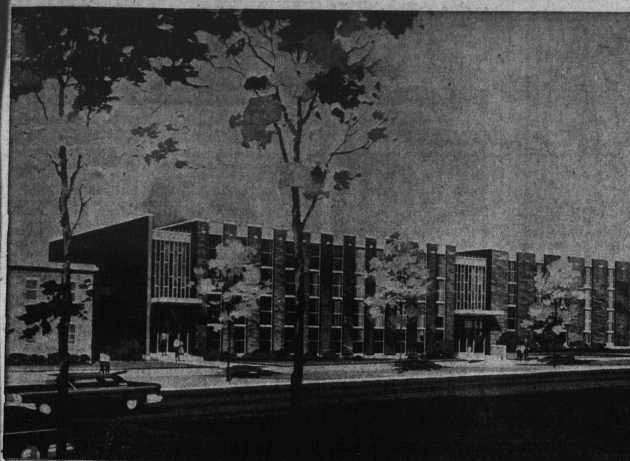

Iona Kombrink, Hart House Orchestra Heard In Concert

Opening the 1962-63 Community Concert series, the Hart House Orchestra, conducted by Boyd Niel, played to a capacity audience at Prince of Wales College last night.

The concert was under the distinguished patronage of Lt.-Gov. F. Walter Hyndman and Mrs. Hyndman; and Premier Walter F. Snow and Mrs. Snow. Gov. Hyndman was accompanied by his aide-de-camp, Fil-L. Ian Rankin.

The 13-member orchestra opened the first portion of the program with the work of the 17th century composer Antonio Vivaldi, Concerto Grosso in D minor, Opus 8, No. 11 - Massello, Largo and Allegro.

For its second number the orchestra chose Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart's composition Divertimento in D, K. 368.

The featured soloist was Iona Kombrink, who sang three arias from the "Magnificat" by Antonio Vivaldi.

Jozef Stravinsky's work Concerto in D-Vivace, Arioso; Andantino; Rondo; Allegro concluded the first half of the concert.

One of the best examples of the many waltzes written by Franz Josef Strauss was performed by the orchestra.

Other selections by the orchestra included two duets based on French-Canadian airs by Ernest MacMillan; Jaques Offenbach's "The Bull Fight"; and Mito Perpetuo by Adolphe Lefler.

Miss Kombrink chose three French selections: "Ave Marie," and the folk song "Go Away From My Window."

Miss Kombrink is regarded as one of the outstanding sopranos of the North American continent today. She made her Canadian operatic debut in "Tosca" in 1957 at the Opera Festival in Montreal. In 1959 she was the winner of the Metropolitan Opera's Auditions of the Air and made her New York City Centre operatic debut in the leading role in "Mozart's 'Maria Golovin'."

Red Cross Clinics Aim For 1,080 Donors Here

"Share Your Good Health" will be the slogan for Charlottetown's fall Red Cross blood drive clinics which will be held a month earlier than usual, according to the chairman, Fremont Archer, after a recent meeting of the local committee at which there was 100 per cent attendance of members.

Through the kindness of the Board of Trustees of Zion Church, the hall facilities which proved to be so convenient for last spring's clinics, have again been placed at the disposal of the Charlottetown committee for the October sessions to be held on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday, Oct. 30 and 31 and Nov. 1.

A special "Hallows" in Blood Donor Party will be featured on Wednesday afternoon from 2 to 4 p.m. Following the evening hours free for families to be at home to receive the large numbers of callers who are usually "on the rounds".

A total of 1,080 donors will be sought in the three days. This quota is based on an attendance of 60 per hour in the morning and afternoon sessions, and 72 per hour in the evenings the same as for all clinics held in P.E.I.

In this way, each centre is on an equal footing in the competition for the "Manning Trophy".
