

Retarded Children Enjoying Life At 'Helping Hand Camp'

Only the lack of staff has held the number of retarded children attending the Helping Hand Camp at only 15 boys and 10 girls down, it was learned last night from Mr. and Mrs. Ernest Lord. This is caused by a shortage of funds necessary to pay a full staff of nearly 20 that would be needed, Mr. Lord said. At present there are 10 employees at the camp with 19 children attending.

At the camp is now being run, Mrs. Lord stated, "It couldn't be a happier atmosphere," however while the camp is large enough to accommodate 60 children the largest group expected this year is 25, at the next camp. The present camp is the second staged this year and the children, all girls, are preparing to go into their final week. The next group, a mixed group, will take over the wonderful facilities next Sunday, followed by the young adult group two weeks later.

The first camp was for boys, aged 12 and the last one is expected to have 20. Mr. and Mrs. Lord both thanked the groups who have made donations which have enabled the children playing facilities, indoor bowling, bearing a full furniture and in the next two weeks later.

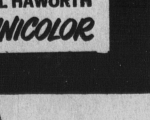

Combined Effort Said Need In Hbr. Problem

"It is our job to give the people of Charlottetown what they want, but it is up to them to pay for it," Sidney Green, chairman of the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply, said yesterday regarding the need for combined effort on the part of the provincial government, the city, and the suburban areas, as a prerequisite to cleaning up the situation and making Charlottetown beaches safe for bathing.

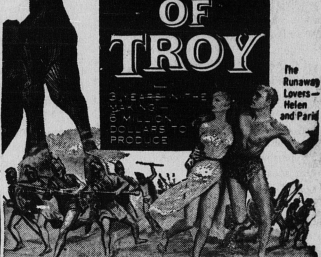
He believes the services of a competent and widely experienced engineering firm should be obtained to make complete surveys and come up with definite suggestions and plans. In this connection, he noted the success of the Flometur survey of the water situation in Charlottetown, and said the solid recommendations made in the report provided a real blueprint for the city and they are now being implemented as quickly as can be done.

Concerning the situation on harbor pollution, he believes it would be useless to try to plan until everything done, to date, has been done with the idea of maintaining the tax rate. However, any improvements asked for by the citizens would be made, he said, with the people knowing what it would cost them.
