### THE CABINET.

Ministers Meet Just After the Election.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

OTTAWA, Nov. 13th.—The first meeting of the Cabinet since the general election, was held yesterday. The ministers swapped election stories and experiences, but serious work was not touched. The question of sending a contingent to Australia to be present at the Inauguration of the Commonwealth has been discussed amongst some of the ministers and the opinion seems to be against it on account of the distance and cost.

The Conservatives have decided to ask for a recount in Ottawa.

The writ for the Nipissing election has been issued. The election will be on Dec. 5th.

Brodeur will be named speaker of the Commons.

Sifton has gone to British Columbia to take a hand in the two postponed elections there.

It is reported that Cartwright is to be High Commissioner.

### THE MONTICELLO.

Thirty-six Persons Lost Their Lives.

HALIFAX, Nov. 13.—Thirty-six persons lost their lives in the Monticello disaster off Yarmouth light on Saturday.

The stewardess, who recovered sufficiently, yesterday, to make a statement about the wreck, enumerated forty persons who were on board. Four only were rescued, and so the number of the dead is increased to thirty-six.

The name of Daniel Surette, of Yarmouth, was added to the list of victims yesterday. The body of Captain Harding has not yet been recovered.

### THE KINGSTON DEAL

Arrangements About Locomotive Works.

KINGSTON, Ont., Nov. 12.—Hon. William Harty, when asked how the locomotive works arrangements were progressing, said that he expects that he will be in full control by December 1st, at the least. The sum of \$25,000 will be expended in the purchasing of additional machinery, so that the works will be able to turn out one large engine every week, as they used to turn out one light engine weekly when Mr. Harty owned the place years ago.

### MAJORITY 34

Latest Figures From the Elections.

OTTAWA, Nov. 13.—The latest election figures give the Laurier Government a majority of thirty-four, not counting the Independents. Elections are to be held at Gaspé, Que. and Yale and Burrard, B.C. Diamond, a Liberal, has been elected in Algoma.

### BRITISH PARLIAMENT.

Cabinet Appointments From the Nobility.

LONDON, Nov. 13.—Parliament will assemble on the third of December to vote the expenses in the South Africa war, which are expected to amount to fully a hundred million pounds.

The Times this morning announces the following appointments: Lord Raglan, Under Secretary of State for War; Earl of Onslow, Under Secretary of State for the Colonies; Earl of Harwyke, Under Secretary of State for India.

"It seems certain," says the Times, "that the cabinet will consist of twenty members,—the largest recorded in our political history."

### A YOUNG CONSERVATIVE SPEAKS OUT.

DEAR SIR,—I was glad to see in your issue of last evening the letters of "Ward 4 East" and of "East Royalty," as well as that of "Liberal-Conservative," and also to see that the Tupper Club is going to get to work again. Conservatives have, I trust, already answered with an emphatic affirmative the question "Shall we or shall we not make a good fight against the Farquharson administration." There are still, however, a few croakers who would, after the defeat of Nov. 7th, altogether relax their efforts in the interest of the Conservative party. Tell it not in Gath! In advocating a suspension of hostilities, they certainly do not show themselves as wishing maladministration replaced by good administration whether in Dominion or Local politics, and they are not doing what their indomitable ex-leader, Sir Charles Tupper, would have done. Suppose there were two thieves in this town—a big and a little one. If the big one, by protesting his innocence and resorting to bribery regains his liberty is that a reason for allowing the little one the continued freedom of the city? Not at all. Now, I do not wish to compare the Farquharson administration to a thief. But I do say this: that it has altogether lost the confidence of the people and that the victory of the Laurier administration is not going to restore that confidence in it. In the coming campaign I hope that Conservatives will not dwell upon such scandals as that connected with the name of Mr. Pineau; that their work will not all be "pulling down"; but that they will call a convention, formulate a good platform, then nominate good men, men who, content to sacrifice their own business or other interests, will enter the arena with the idea of performing a duty; and lastly that they will work hard and earnestly for these men. If they do this I feel sure that the mass of the people, will be with them; that the present Government will be replaced by a Conservative one, of which there will be no reason to be ashamed and every reason to be proud.

### KRUGER'S LAST CARD.

Granddaughter Says He Has Efficacious Means of Action.

MARSEILLES, Nov. 12.—Mrs. Eloff has arrived here to await the arrival of Mr. Kruger, her grandfather, on the Dutch cruiser Gelderland. In the course of an interview she said:—"The difficulties surrounding Great Britain are so great that the Boers are convinced they will finally gain the upper hand. We have the greatest confidence in the journey of the President, who, in spite of his great age and fatigue, will travel across Europe. He only decided to come because he has in his possession a very efficacious means of action."

### LORD CURZON.

On the Value of India.

BOMBAY, Nov. 12.—Lord Curzon, Viceroy of India, is making a tour through the presidency. At a large meeting held here he emphasized the importance of India as part of the British Empire. He said India's arm reaches as far as China and Africa, and it was the Indian-British troops, he said, that saved Natal and that helped to rescue the Legations at Peking.
