

# St Dunstons Ousted

The Island's Saints lost 6-2 to UNB but came back with a surprising 9-2 win over St. Thomas Saturday afternoon. The UNB Red Devils, in the meantime, wound up their schedule as expected, posting an easy 6-0 win over Mount Allison University Saturday night.

With all Conference games completed UNB and St. Dunstons were tied for first place with 26 points and the Tommies were definitely out of the picture with only 22 points.

No provisions were made in the league constitution as to what would happen if a first place tie resulted at the end of regular league play, but if a second place team had defeated a team finishing first in the first place team, the second place team is eligible to challenge for the crown.

The Conference executive declared a special ruling Sunday night, giving UNB the crown because of their two regular conference wins over the Islanders.

There is little doubt in our mind that in three of any four meetings UNB would win with 26 points and the Tommies would finish with 22 points.

We trust in conclusion that the executive of the MIC Hockey Conference will be ruling for next season in case of a first place tie so that such a situation will not be permitted to arise.
