**War in The Transvaal**

**Particulars of the Struggle in South Africa.**

**A Famous Corps.**  
The Suffolk Regiment, formerly known as the 12th Foot, is one of the veteran corps of the British army. Though it did not take regimental shape until about 1685, it existed in the form of companies in the first years that followed the Restoration. Even as a regimental organization it has passed its 200th anniversary. Although however, it saw plenty of service during its first half century of regimental life, it does not bear on its colors the name of any earlier battlefield than Dettingen. It was known as Wharton's Regiment during the Revolution, was with Schomberg in Ireland, fought at the Boyne, and, after the war, was sent to Flanders. There it had an unpleasant experience. Through the influence of a Dutch Governor (for England was then the ally of the Netherlands against France) the force of which the regiment formed a part was made to surrender. Colonel Brewer protested, but in vain, though his spirit was recalled later on to his credit, when some other officers were rebuked. After serving in the West Indies, and at Minorca, the 12th was part of Ingoldby's brigade at Fontenoy, where it fought with great valor and lost heavily. The 12th shared in the Seven Years' War, and fought at Minden, Kirch Deukern, Grobenstein, Luttreberg, Homburg and Cassel. In the defence of Gibraltar, under the valiant Elliot, the 12th won its badge, the Castle and Key. It lost during the siege 174 of all ranks. At Martinique and Gaudeloupe, the 12th also suffered great loss. After participating in the disastrous retreat from Bremen, it proceeded to the Cape. It thus served in the colony at the very outset of British rule (1796). After a stay in South Africa, the Regiment continued its course to India, where it occupied a position of special distinction. In the great Peninsular war it won two of the proudest names on its colors. At Seringapatam Col. Shaw used the words, "up 12th and charge"—very like those attributed to the Duke of Wellington at Waterloo. It formed part of the storming party. In Southern India the 12th did splendid service under Colonel Picton, brother of the more famous Waterloo general. During the long peace that ended with the Crimea, the 12th was not idle. It served both in the Kaffir war, and in that against the Maoris. The Afghan campaign of 1878-80 gave it a chance of gaining fresh laurels in a field moistened by much British blood. Of the record of honor that summarizes the history of the Suffolk Regiment, Minden and Gibraltar embody the most noteworthy chapters. But India, Africa, 1851-53, New Zealand, and Afghanistan, 1878-79, are honors worthy to be kept untarnished. The motto: "Montes insignia Calpe," refers to the glorious achievements that won it fame at Gibraltar. The uniform is scarlet, with white facings, and cap and collar are the castle and key in a laurel wreath with a crown above, and the word "Gibraltar," below.

**Banza for Cable Company.**  
The war in South Africa is a bonanza to the two cable companies which transmit all telegraph messages to and from that part of the world. One route is by way of Lisbon, Gibraltar, Malta, Aden and east coast of Africa, to Durban, the seaport of the British Colony of Natal. The other is by the west coast of Cape Town. A British military censorship of despatches is exercised at Aden, and presumably at

Cape Town also, so that all communications with South Africa by telegraph, is completely under Government control. Despite the censorship, an enormous business is done. The rate per word for ordinary message over the cable routes from New York to Cape Town and Durban is \$1.23. Press rates are much lower, but still the Eastern Company, which owns both cables to Africa, is taking in great sums for tolls in newspaper despatches, while the Government business is enormous.

**Wireless Telegraphy.**  
Experiments with the Marconi system of wireless telegraphy have been tried lately between the De Ar and Modder River stations and various intermediate points. Messages have been successfully sent between Orange River and Enslin. Great difficulty has been experienced and little further success has been attained, owing to the odd fact that the extraordinary amount of iron in the neighboring hills played all sorts of pranks with the system. The wireless telegraphy plant consigned to the Boers, which was seized at Cape Town recently, was not found workable. It seems to be on a par with the greater number of Boer shells. It is understood that the captured plant was supplied to the Boers by a British firm. The matter will be the subject of an enquiry in the British Parliament. The Wheatstone system is being worked by London telegraph volunteers between De Ar and the Modder River and is proving a great success, although this is the first time it has ever been used in war. It transmits 240 words a minute each way on one wire, thus enabling a single wire to do the work of seven ordinary military lines. The immense advantages of this are obvious.

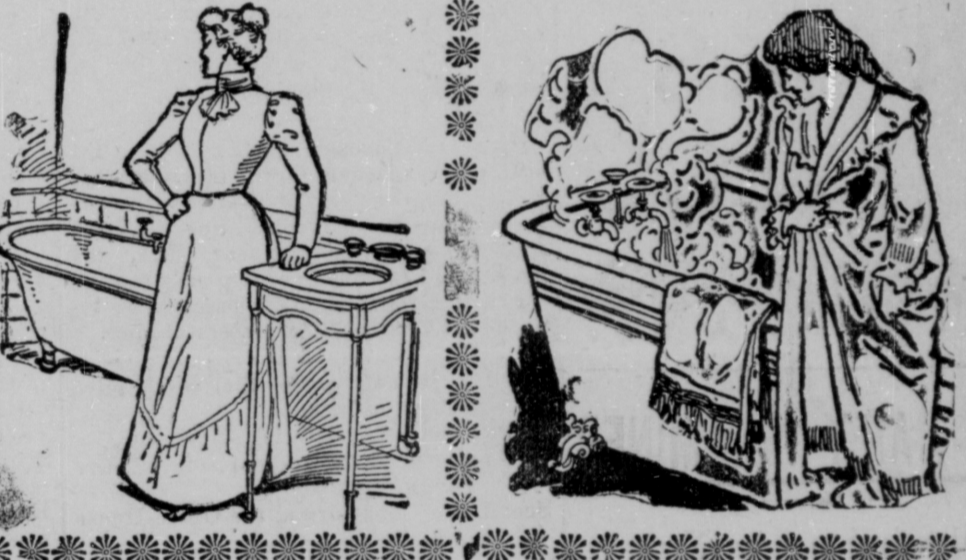
