JOHN EDWARD HEARTZ

The hearts of the people of the community of Cornwall and surrounding districts were saddened by the sudden passing of John Edward Hartz on June 15, 1965. Although he was not a well man for a number of years, nevertheless, his death was a shock to those nearest and dearest to him.

He was a home in which one always found a welcome and good conversation. He possessed a fine tenor voice and gave of his talent unstintingly.

He was born in North River on February 2, 1891, the son of the late Joseph Hartz and Margaret Jenkins Hartz. Early in his life his family moved to Cornwall. He attended school there and later Prince of Wales College. Then for a number of years he taught school in South Shore, Meadowbank, Cornwall and other districts.

From 1916 to 1919 he served as a private with the Fifth Seige Battery. During World War II, he was with the Veteran's Guard, holding the rank of Warrent Officer, second class.

He is survived by one brother Arthur, and three sisters: Sadie, Mrs. George Gillespie of Clyde River, Caroline, Mrs. James Livingston of Clyde River and Josephine, Mrs. Charles Grant of Rochester, N.Y.

He was predeceased by one brother George and two sisters: Elizabeth, Mrs. Edward Everett of Cornwall and formerly of Jamaica Plain, Mass. and May, Mrs. Harry Kerr of Boston, Mass.

The funeral was held from the MacLean Funeral Home with his pastor, the Rev. T.W. Howard officiating. Two solo, "The Lord's My Shepherd" by Arthur N. Hartz, a nephew, and "Cast Thy Burden" by Stirling Inman, a close family friend, were sung. Mrs. Leigh Dingwell was the organist.

The pallbearers were Andrew Gass, Louis MacDonald, George Hyde, Edward MacPhail, Heber MacPhail and Robert Jewell.

Interment was in the cemetery of the Clyde River Baptist Church.
