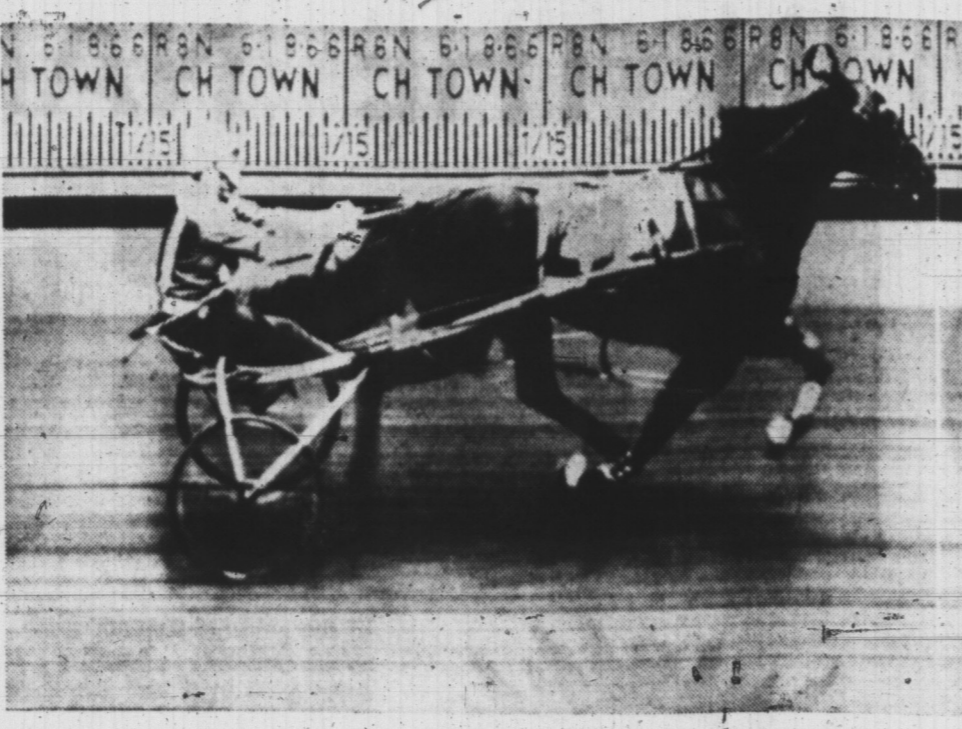
Dashes 5 and 8 have eight fast pacers bidding for top honors

Island Shooters Finish In Third

SUSSEX, N.B. (CP) — New Brunswick rifle shots scored a record 790 as they retained the Inter-Maritime team championship Saturday against challenges from Nova Scotia and Prince Edward Island.

The New Brunswickers took the lead at 200 yards and never were in danger of losing it. Nova Scotia made a bid at 500 yards, reducing the host team's lead to four points. New Brunswick picked up another eight points at 600 yards for a final advantage of 12 points.

The Nova Scotians finished with 778 while Prince Edward Island was another 20 points back with 758.

Although there have been higher scores than New Brunswick's 790 out of 825, the mark is a record for the smaller, bullseye now being used.
