roundings might have aggravated and continues to aggravate the mental and emotional symptoms present.

What may help in diagnosing and treating various brain disturbances is an instrument which traces the movements or rhythm of movements of the brain. These tracings are not unlike the tracings made by the heart, known as electrocardiographic tracings. They are called electroencephalographic tracings, the tracing itself being called an electroencephalogram. I have written before of its use in diagnosing epilepsy.

In Medical Weekly, Buenos Aires, Drs. R. R. G. Herrera and H. L. Guixa state that electroencephalographic tracings are reliable in: (1) the diagnosis of epilepsy and the types of epilepsy; (2) the diagnosis of early signs (potential) of neuropsychiatric (structure and behavior) disease; (3) civil, legal, and industrial cases; (4) early diagnosis of tumor of the brain and early discovery of changes or disturbance of brain structure; (5) the diagnosis of small extensions of cancer after removal of the main cancer; (6) evaluating normal functions of the brain in air force, army, and navy personnel, and (7) eugenics, not permitting the marriage of persons with abnormal movements of the brain. This instrument should be of great value in these hectic days.

**Chair In Law At
Dalhousie University**

HALIFAX, N. S., Dec. 22 — Creation of the "Sir James Dunn, Bart. Chair in Law" at Dalhousie University as the result of a very generous gift from the Algoma Steel Corporation, Limited, is announced by President A. E. Kerr. Also established at the University is the "Algoma Steel Corporation Foundation in Law" to administer the funds donated by the Company for the support of the new Chair and also for development of the Dalhousie Law School in furtherance of its teaching and research program and particularly to facilitate undertaking post-graduate instruction in law. The Company has undertaken to support the Foundation for a period of twenty-five years.

The new professorship is named in honour of the President of the Company, Sir James Dunn, Bart., K. C., LL. D., who is one of the most distinguished and loyal alumni of the Law School.

According to Dean Horace E. Read of the Law School, continuous development of the program of post-graduate work in public law, begun this fall at the Law School, is ensured by this munificent gift, and by the increase in full-time faculty that will result.

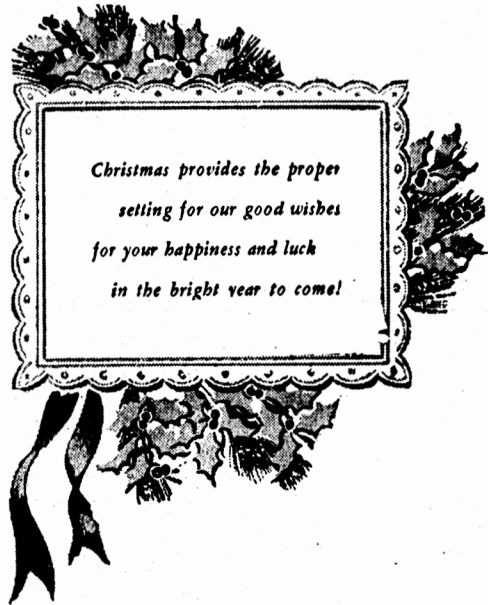
