# MARKETS and FINANCE Housing Construction Market Reach Record This Year

## New York Stocks

**NEW YORK (AP)**—The stock market was pulled out of a slump Wednesday by a late rally, but the force of the recovery movement wasn't enough to create a definitely higher trend.  
The rally was in the hands of railroads, steels, motors, and coppers, which had been strong throughout the session.  
These four divisions held to almost the best of their gains to the close. The majority of the aircrafts were higher, some at the top of the rise, but other divisions were lower or unchanged.  
The Associated Press average of 60 stocks was up 40 cents at \$171. A rise of \$1.18 in the railroad component was responsible for most of that boost. The industrial component remained unchanged while utilities declined 10 cents or more.

The bureau of statistics said Wednesday exports were 467,433 tons, up from 412,843. June shipments amounted to 91,530 tons, up from 78,960 in the corresponding month last year.

## Housing Construction Market Reach Record This Year

**OTTAWA (CP)**—Housing construction in Canada this year may reach a record of 105,000 units, federal officials said Wednesday after looking at the figures for the first six months of the year.  
The bureau of statistics said that in the January-June period a record of 57,997 houses were started, a 25-per cent increase from the previous high of 46,988 in the corresponding period last year.  
Completions of new dwellings reached 52,225, up 26 per cent over last year's first-half record of 41,572.  
On the basis of those figures for the half-year, officials estimated that 1954's totals of 101,965 completions and 113,527 starts will have exceeded this year.  
The bureau could give no estimate of the value or cost of the new housing starts and completions.  
**LOANS SURPASS 1954**  
However, Central Housing and Mortgage Corporation reported that for the first six months approved 28,062 loans amounting to \$312,125,340. These figures surpassed the previous record for 1954, of 17,011 loans valued at \$196,857,228.

**NEW WESTMINSTER (CP)**—A farmers' co-operative which started 20 years ago with a capital of \$250 now has a huge credit rating.  
Charles Westoby, pipe-smoking English bank clerk, launched the project over a cracker barrel.  
"We will gross about \$150,000 this year," he said, "but if I put a big shiny desk in my office the poultrymen would never tell me their troubles."  
This philosophy has paid off handsomely for the Coquitlam District Farmers' Institute and the hundreds of farmers who have come to him for aid.
