OTTAWA (CP) - The Supreme Court of Canada established a precedent when it heard a second appeal by Georges Marcotte, a Quebec farmer, against a St. Laurent, Que., policeman.
The first time the court had heard a second appeal against a capital murder conviction it was in 1957.
Marcotte was convicted of capital murder in the machine-gunning slaying of Constable Claude Marcotte, a bank holiday, St. Laurent, in December, 1962.
Marcotte, scheduled to be hanged on Tuesday, has appealed against his March, 1963, conviction in the Quebec Appeal Court and in the Supreme Court of Canada.
Last September Justice Minister Favrea directed the Quebec Appeal Court to consider new evidence that had come to the attention of Yves Mayrand, defence counsel for Marcotte.
The Quebec court, in the evidence, as if it were a second appeal to the Supreme Court, earlier decision dismissing an appeal against the murder conviction.
REQUEST TURNED DOWN
Later, Judge Roger Outim of the Quebec Superior Court turned down the appeal by Mayrand for a stay of execution to permit Marcotte to appeal to the Supreme Court against the Sept. 17 decision of the Quebec Appeal Court.
A Quebec Prosecutor Jacques Duross argued the Quebec Court of Appeal decision was based on a procedural irregularity put forward by Mr. Mayrand and was not an appeal. He contended that Marcotte should be appealed to the Supreme Court of Canada.
However, Sept. 23 the federal cabinet postponed Marcotte's execution date from Sept. 23 to Dec. 4 to permit the appeal in the Supreme Court against the Quebec Appeal Court's decision.
This appeal was heard Wednesday by the Supreme Court here. It reserved decision. Judgment is expected within the next two weeks.
