## KEEP IN TRIM

### Overweight Teen-age Girls Are Most Poorly Nourished

Overweight Teen-age girls, brace yourselves. Hear this: Of all teen-agers and all overweight girls, you girls have the worst food habits. At a recent national conference where the nutritional problems of all age groups were discussed, the greatest danger zone was found in the eating habits of the teen-agers, particularly of the overweight girls.

The Nutrition Education Conference, held in Washington, D.C., was sponsored by the U.S. Department of Agriculture Nutrition Committee and the Interagency Committee on Nutrition Education and School Lunch. Dr. Erce Eppright, head of the Food and Nutrition Department, Home Economics Division of Iowa State College, discussed the problems of teenage nutrition.

"According to nation-wide studies in the past few years, teen-agers stand first on the list of children who need for guidance in their eating habits."

"Nutritionally speaking, teen-agers are generally considered to be in a deplorable state," Dr. Eppright declared.

**BOYS BETTER NOURISHED**  
Teen-age boys are better nourished than teen-age girls, she points out. Our authority explained that this is probably due to the fact that boys are generally more active than girls and have larger appetites. They eat more food, and probably more by chance than by planning, include more of the essential foods in daily fare.

In comparison, teen-age girls tend to eat less as they grow older, usually cut down on the foods which are vital to health.

"The heavy teen-age girls have especially poor diets, the doctor asserted. Studies revealed that on the basis of eating habits alone, there were fewer overweight girls among those who ate a well balanced diet, regardless of calories. (That there were in those groups had diets lacking in food essentials.)

**MISTAKEN NOTION**  
For those of you who have the mistaken notion that breakfast is fattening, here's an eye-opener. With teen-age girls, as the calories at breakfast decrease, the calories from snacks increase. Snacks generally are less nutritious than breakfasts . . . and consist of fasteners.
