## New Record Is Set By CN Ferry Service

BORDEN (Special) — Canadian National's Northumberland Strait ferry service set a new monthly record in passenger traffic during August.

The number of passengers handled on the Borden-Cape Tormentine run surpassed the previous record established in July this year by 1,426.

During August, the ferries carried 164,925 persons and 58,816 vehicles between Prince Edward Island and New Brunswick. Increases of 13,589 and 5,481 respectively compared with the same month last year, when P.E.I. centennial celebrations were in full swing.

CN's charter bus service handled 4,158 persons last month, an increase of 2,520 over the same month last year.

"Traffic has been increasing every year," said J. G. Davis, manager of CN's maritime area. "More and more Canadians are visiting the Maritimes than ever before and this, coupled with the American tourist-traffic, is producing the record traffic."

In August, the ferries Abegweit, Prince Edward Island and the Confederation carried 48,853 cars, 2,573 trucks, 1,143 tractor-trailers, 386 buses, 74 motorcycles and 3,787 passenger trailers.

With the ferry service offering 38 crossings every day this summer, the greatest number of daily crossings ever, the Abegweit made 401 crossings, the Prince Edward Island 418 and the Confederation 437, last month.

From the first of January to the end of August, 1965, CN has carried 503,996 persons and 195,258 vehicles over the waters of the Northumberland Strait. During the same period of 1964, the ferry service handled 431,899 passengers and 172,881 vehicles.
